### **Proximity as a Noun**

#### Definitions of "Proximity" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "proximity" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- Nearness in space, time, or relationship.
- *The property of being close together.*
- A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit.
- The region close around a person or thing.





## Synonyms of "Proximity" as a noun (7 Words)

adjacency	The attribute of being so near as to be touching.
<u>closeness</u>	Close or warm friendship. The scoreline did not reflect the <b>closeness</b> of the contest.
<u>juxtaposition</u>	The fact of two things being seen or placed close together with contrasting effect. It is the result of the <b>juxtaposition</b> of contrasting colors.
law of proximity	The force of policemen and officers.
nearness	The condition of being near; proximity. <i>The town s <b>nearness</b> to London.</i>
<u>presence</u>	A group of people, especially soldiers or police, stationed in a particular place. The <b>presence</b> of chlorine in the atmosphere.




# propinquityThe state of being close to someone or something; proximity.<br/>He kept his distance as though afraid propinquity might lead him into<br/>temptation.

## Associations of "Proximity" (30 Words)

about	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>In just <b>about</b> a minute.</i>
<u>acquaintance</u>	Acquaintances considered collectively. I renewed my <b>acquaintance</b> with Herbert.
<u>almost</u>	Not quite; very nearly. He <b>almost</b> knocked Georgina over.
<u>ambient</u>	Relating to ambient music. <i>The <b>ambient</b> temperature.</i>
<u>approximate</u>	Close to the actual, but not completely accurate or exact. <i>Approximate leaves grow together but are not united.</i>
approximately	Used to show that something is almost, but not completely, accurate or exact; roughly. Lasted <b>approximately</b> an hour.
approximation	The quality of coming near to identity (especially close in quantity. The band smashed up their equipment in an <b>approximation</b> of rock star behaviour.
around	All around or on all sides. There was no one <b>around</b> .
<u>broadly</u>	Widely and openly. The climate is <b>broadly</b> similar in the two regions.
close	Fitting closely but comfortably. <i>Cloth with a close weave.</i>
<u>closely</u>	Very affectionately or intimately. Both children are clearly very <b>closely</b> attached to their parents.
<u>closeness</u>	Close or warm friendship. The <b>closeness</b> with which he watched current events.
<u>distance</u>	Beat a horse by a distance. Watching them from a <b>distance</b> .
environ	Surround; enclose. The stone circle was <b>environ</b> ed by an expanse of peat soil.
equidistant	At equal distances. The line joins together all points which are <b>equidistant</b> from the two axes.
<u>familiar</u>	A close friend or associate. Ensure that you are <b>familiar</b> with the heating controls.



friend	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. I am <b>friend</b> ed by 29 people who I have not <b>friend</b> ed back.
<u>gauge</u>	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>Gauge</i> bricks.
<b>generally</b>	In most cases; usually. The best scheme is <b>generally</b> reckoned to be the Canadian one.
intimacy	A feeling of being intimate and belonging together. The <b>intimacy</b> between a husband and wife.
<u>involvement</u>	A sense of concern with and curiosity about someone or something. She knew that <b>involvement</b> with Adam would only complicate her life.
near	Nearly. His <b>near</b> est approach to success.
<u>nearby</u>	Close at hand. Concentrated his study on the <b>nearby</b> planet Venus.
<u>nearly</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. In the absence of anyone more <b>nearly</b> related I was designated next of kin.
nearness	The spatial property resulting from a relatively small distance. <i>The town s <b>nearness</b> to London.</i>
<u>pivotal</u>	Being of crucial importance- Henry Kissinger. A sliding or <b>pivotal</b> motion.
proximate	Nearly accurate approximate. Interest in <b>proximate</b> rather than ultimate goals.
<u>roughly</u>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. This is a walk of <b>roughly</b> 13 miles.
<u>round</u>	Give a round shape to. I did a newspaper <b>round</b> .
thereabout	Near that time or date. <i>Come at noon or <b>thereabout</b>s.</i>
