#### Definitions of "Proximity" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "proximity" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- Nearness in space, time, or relationship.
- The property of being close together.
- A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit.
- The region close around a person or thing.

**adjacency** The attribute of being so near as to be touching.

propinquity


The state of being close to someone or something; proximity. He kept his distance as though afraid **propinquity** might lead him into temptation.
