### Definitions of "Pseudonym" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pseudonym” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A fictitious name used when the person performs a particular social role.*
- *A fictitious name, especially one used by an author.*

### Synonyms of "Pseudonym" as a noun (10 Words)

#### [alias](#)

An alternative name or label that refers to a file, command, address, or other item, and can be used to locate or access it.  
*A spy operating under the **alias** Barsad.*

#### **anonym**

An anonymous person or publication.

#### **false name**

A language unit by which a person or thing is known.

#### **incognito**

An assumed or false identity.  
*She is locked in her **incognito**.*

#### [nickname](#)

A familiar name for a person (often a shortened version of a person's given name).  
*Mallender's fair complexion gave rise to his **nickname** Ghost.*

<b>nom de guerre</b>	A fictitious name used when the person performs a particular social role.
<b>pen name</b>	A correctional institution for those convicted of major crimes.
<b>professional name</b>	An authority qualified to teach apprentices.
<b>sobriquet</b>	A familiar name for a person (often a shortened version of a person's given name. <i>She was a vast and haughty person who answered to the <b>sobriquet</b> Duchesse.</i>
<b>stage name</b>	A large coach-and-four formerly used to carry passengers and mail on regular routes between towns.

## Associations of "Pseudonym" (30 Words)

<b><u>alias</u></b>	Misidentify (a signal frequency), introducing distortion or error. <i>A spy operating under the <b>alias</b> Barsad.</i>
<b>anagram</b>	A word, phrase, or name formed by rearranging the letters of another, such as spar, formed from rasp.
<b>anonymity</b>	Lack of outstanding, individual, or unusual features; impersonality. <i>The <b>anonymity</b> of big city life definitely has its advantages.</i>
<b>anonymous</b>	Not known or lacking marked individuality. <i>His impeccable slightly <b>anonymous</b> Chelsea flat.</i>
<b>anonymously</b>	Without giving a name. <i>The <b>anonymously</b> furnished parlour.</i>
<b>author</b>	Be the author of a book or piece of writing. <i>She has <b>authored</b> several articles on wildlife.</i>
<b>ballot</b>	Vote by ballot. <i>He won 54 per cent of the <b>ballot</b>.</i>
<b><u>blind</u></b>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>He was going into the interview <b>blind</b>.</i>
<b>election</b>	The predestination of some individuals as objects of divine mercy (especially as conceived by Calvinists). <i>They celebrated his <b>election</b>.</i>

<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Invent (something) in order to deceive. <i>The company <b>fabricates</b> plastic chairs.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	A deliberately false or improbable account. <i>The assembly and <b>fabrication</b> of electronic products.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A thing that someone believes to be real but that exists only in their imagination. <i>A <b>figment</b> of the imagination.</i>
<b>incognito</b>	With your identity concealed. <i>She is locked in her <b>incognito</b>.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i><b>Inglorious</b> though the peasants may have been this is not synonymous with mute.</i>
<b><u>involuntary</u></b>	Done against someone's will; compulsory. <i><b>Involuntary</b> muscles.</i>
<b>make</b>	Compel or make somebody or something to act in a certain way. <i>Four and four <b>make</b> eight.</i>
<b><u>name</u></b>	Of a person or product having a well known name. <i>He wanted to protect his good <b>name</b>.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>The myths talk about <b>nameless</b> horrors infesting our universe.</i>
<b>reproducible</b>	Capable of being reproduced. <i>Astonishingly <b>reproducible</b> results can be obtained.</i>
<b><u>scribe</u></b>	French playwright (1791-1861). <i>Mark the position of the lock body on the door edge then <b>scribe</b> a centre mark.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>The combination to the safe was a <b>secret</b>.</i>
<b>sobriquet</b>	A person's nickname. <i>She was a vast and haughty person who answered to the <b>sobriquet</b> Duchesse.</i>
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	Not fully understood, recognized, or valued. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i><b>Undiagnosed</b> disease.</i>

<u>unfamiliar</u>	Not having knowledge or experience of. <i>He seems <b>unfamiliar</b> with recent research on this topic.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Not yet identified. <i>A picture of an <b>unidentified</b> motorcyclist.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	That which is unknown. <i>Exploration into <b>unknown</b> territory.</i>
<u>unnamed</u>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>The <b>unnamed</b> man was found unconscious.</i>
<u>vote</u>	Cause someone to gain or lose a particular post or honour by means of a vote. <i>They put the question to a <b>vote</b>.</i>
