Synonyms of "Psychic" as a noun (21 Words)

astrologer	Someone who predicts the future by the positions of the planets and sun and Moon. <i>He was advised by astrologers to delay his departure.</i>
augur	(ancient Rome) a religious official who interpreted omens to guide public policy.
cassandra	A prophetess in Troy during the Trojan War whose predictions were true but were never believed.
chiromancer	Fortuneteller who predicts your future by the lines on your palms.
clairvoyant	Someone who has the power of clairvoyance. <i>She has had a message from a clairvoyant that her son is alive and well.</i>
crystal gazer	A rock formed by the solidification of a substance; has regularly repeating internal structure; external plane faces.
forecaster of the future	Someone who makes predictions of the future (usually on the basis of special knowledge).
fortune teller	An unknown and unpredictable phenomenon that causes an event to result one way rather than another.

<u>medium</u>	An intervening substance through which signals can travel as a means for communication. <i>These cells are grown in a nutrient rich medium.</i>
mind reader	Knowledge and intellectual ability.
oracle	A response or message given by an oracle especially an ambiguous one. <i>He reigned supreme as the Colonial Office's oracle on Africa.</i>
palm reader	Any plant of the family Palmae having an unbranched trunk crowned by large pinnate or palmate leaves.
palmist	A person who practises palmistry a palm reader.
prognosticator	A person who foretells or prophesies a future event. <i>There are many prognosticators predicting the worst.</i>
prophesier	An authoritative person who divines the future.
<u>prophet</u>	In Jewish use one of the three canonical divisions of the Hebrew Bible distinguished from the Law and the Hagiographa and comprising the books of Joshua Judges Samuel Kings Jeremiah Ezekiel Isaiah and the twelve minor prophets. <i>He is repeatedly hailed as a prophet of modernism.</i>
seer	An authoritative person who divines the future. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
sibyl	A woman in ancient times who was thought to utter the prophecies of a god.
soothsayer	A person supposed to be able to foresee the future.
spiritualist	An advocate of the doctrine that the spirit exists as distinct from matter, or that spirit is the only reality. <i>A non denominational spiritualist.</i>
telepathist	A magician who seems to discern the thoughts of another person (usually by clever signals from an accomplice).

- *Appearing or considered to have powers of telepathy or clairvoyance.*
- *Relating to the soul or mind.*

- *Outside the sphere of physical science.*
- *Denoting a bid that deliberately misrepresents the bidder's hand, in order to mislead the opponents.*
- *Relating to or denoting faculties or phenomena that are apparently inexplicable by natural laws, especially involving telepathy or clairvoyance.*
- *Affecting or influenced by the human mind.*

Perceiving things beyond the natural range of the senses.
*He didn't tell me about it and I'm not **clairvoyant**.*

emotional	Determined or actuated by emotion rather than reason. <i>He was a strongly emotional young man.</i>
extrasensory	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.
inner	Innermost or essential. <i>A speaker s inner thoughts.</i>
magic	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>A magic wand.</i>
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>It was a magical evening of pure nostalgia.</i>
<u>metaphysical</u>	Of or characteristic of the metaphysical poets. <i>Metaphysical forces.</i>
<u>mystic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of mysticism. <i>The mystical style of Blake.</i>
<u>mystical</u>	Inspiring a sense of spiritual mystery, awe, and fascination. <i>The mystical theology of Richard Rolle.</i>
<u>occult</u>	Hidden and difficult to see. <i>Occult blood in the stool.</i>
paranormal	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>What seemed to be paranormal manifestations.</i>
preternatural	Beyond what is normal or natural. <i>Autumn had arrived with preternatural speed.</i>
psychical	Outside the sphere of physical science.
<u>psychological</u>	Mental or emotional as opposed to physical in nature. <i>It was concluded that her pain was psychological.</i>
<u>spiritual</u>	Lacking material body or form or substance-Lewis Mumford. <i>I m responsible for his spiritual welfare.</i>
spiritualistic	Of or relating to or connected with spiritualism.
supernatural	Unnaturally or extraordinarily great. <i>Supernatural forces and occurrences and beings.</i>
supernormal	Beyond the range of the normal or scientifically explainable. <i>Years of supernormal employment during the war.</i>
telepathic	Relating to or characteristic of telepathy. <i>A team of telepathic superheroes who can read each other s thoughts.</i>

- transcendental** Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley.
*The **transcendental** importance of each person s soul.*
- with a sixth sense** Coming next after the fifth and just before the seventh in position.
- with second sight** Coming next after the first in position in space or time or degree or magnitude.

hypnotism	The study or practice of hypnosis.
incapacity	Legal disqualification. <i>They are not subject to any legal incapacity.</i>
insight	The clear (and often sudden) understanding of a complex situation. <i>The town offers some insight into Finnish rural life.</i>
intuition	An impression that something might be the case. <i>Your insights and intuitions as a native speaker are positively sought.</i>
mesmerism	The act of inducing hypnosis.
paranormal	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>A mystic who can prove he has paranormal powers.</i>
parapsychology	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
psychiatric	Relating to mental illness or its treatment. <i>Psychiatric hospital.</i>
psychoanalysis	A system of psychological theory and therapy which aims to treat mental disorders by investigating the interaction of conscious and unconscious elements in the mind and bringing repressed fears and conflicts into the conscious mind by techniques such as dream interpretation and free association. <i>His physician recommended psychoanalysis.</i>
<u>psychological</u>	Mental or emotional as opposed to physical in nature. <i>Give psychological support.</i>
psychologist	A scientist trained in psychology. <i>Psychologists are being called in to help employees cope with job losses.</i>
psychotherapy	The treatment of mental disorder by psychological rather than medical means.
semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.

sense	Relating to or denoting a coding sequence of nucleotides complementary to an antisense sequence. <i>With the first frost they could sense a change in the days.</i>
spirit	Infuse with spirit. <i>The rule had been broken in spirit if not in letter.</i>
<u>subconscious</u>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. <i>My subconscious fear.</i>
supernatural	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>A supernatural being.</i>
telepathy	Apparent communication from one mind to another without using sensory perceptions.
<u>trauma</u>	A deeply distressing or disturbing experience. <i>The event is relived with all the accompanying trauma.</i>
<u>visceral</u>	Relating to deep inward feelings rather than to the intellect. <i>Visceral bleeding.</i>
