<b>astrologer</b>	Someone who predicts the future by the positions of the planets and sun and Moon. <i>He was advised by <b>astrologers</b> to delay his departure.</i>
<b>augur</b>	(ancient Rome) a religious official who interpreted omens to guide public policy.
<b>cassandra</b>	A prophetess in Troy during the Trojan War whose predictions were true but were never believed.
<b>chiromancer</b>	Fortuneteller who predicts your future by the lines on your palms.
<b>clairvoyant</b>	Someone who has the power of clairvoyance. <i>She has had a message from a <b>clairvoyant</b> that her son is alive and well.</i>
<b>crystal gazer</b>	A rock formed by the solidification of a substance; has regularly repeating internal structure; external plane faces.
<b>forecaster of the future</b>	Someone who makes predictions of the future (usually on the basis of special knowledge).
<b>fortune teller</b>	An unknown and unpredictable phenomenon that causes an event to result one way rather than another.

<b><u>medium</u></b>	An intervening substance through which signals can travel as a means for communication. <i>These cells are grown in a nutrient rich <b>medium</b>.</i>
<b>mind reader</b>	Knowledge and intellectual ability.
<b>oracle</b>	A response or message given by an oracle especially an ambiguous one. <i>He reigned supreme as the Colonial Office's <b>oracle</b> on Africa.</i>
<b>palm reader</b>	Any plant of the family Palmae having an unbranched trunk crowned by large pinnate or palmate leaves.
<b>palmist</b>	A person who practises palmistry a palm reader.
<b>prognosticator</b>	A person who foretells or prophesies a future event. <i>There are many <b>prognosticators</b> predicting the worst.</i>
<b>prophesier</b>	An authoritative person who divines the future.
<b><u>prophet</u></b>	In Jewish use one of the three canonical divisions of the Hebrew Bible distinguished from the Law and the Hagiographa and comprising the books of Joshua Judges Samuel Kings Jeremiah Ezekiel Isaiah and the twelve minor prophets. <i>He is repeatedly hailed as a <b>prophet</b> of modernism.</i>
<b>seer</b>	An authoritative person who divines the future. <i>A <b>seer</b> had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
<b>sibyl</b>	A woman in ancient times who was thought to utter the prophecies of a god.
<b>soothsayer</b>	A person supposed to be able to foresee the future.
<b>spiritualist</b>	An advocate of the doctrine that the spirit exists as distinct from matter, or that spirit is the only reality. <i>A non denominational <b>spiritualist</b>.</i>
<b>telepathist</b>	A magician who seems to discern the thoughts of another person (usually by clever signals from an accomplice).

### Definitions of "Psychic" as an adjective

- *Appearing or considered to have powers of telepathy or clairvoyance.*
- *Relating to the soul or mind.*

- *Outside the sphere of physical science.*
- *Denoting a bid that deliberately misrepresents the bidder's hand, in order to mislead the opponents.*
- *Relating to or denoting faculties or phenomena that are apparently inexplicable by natural laws, especially involving telepathy or clairvoyance.*
- *Affecting or influenced by the human mind.*

<u><b>metaphysical</b></u>	Of or characteristic of the metaphysical poets. <i><b>Metaphysical</b> forces.</i>
<u><b>mystic</b></u>	Relating to or characteristic of mysticism. <i>The <b>mystical</b> style of Blake.</i>
<u><b>mystical</b></u>	Inspiring a sense of spiritual mystery, awe, and fascination. <i>The <b>mystical</b> theology of Richard Rolle.</i>
<u><b>occult</b></u>	Hidden and difficult to see. <i><b>Occult</b> blood in the stool.</i>
<b>paranormal</b>	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>What seemed to be <b>paranormal</b> manifestations.</i>
<b>preternatural</b>	Beyond what is normal or natural. <i>Autumn had arrived with <b>preternatural</b> speed.</i>
<b>psychical</b>	Outside the sphere of physical science.
<u><b>psychological</b></u>	Mental or emotional as opposed to physical in nature. <i>It was concluded that her pain was <b>psychological</b>.</i>
<u><b>spiritual</b></u>	Lacking material body or form or substance-Lewis Mumford. <i>I m responsible for his <b>spiritual</b> welfare.</i>
<b>spiritualistic</b>	Of or relating to or connected with spiritualism.
<b>supernatural</b>	Unnaturally or extraordinarily great. <i><b>Supernatural</b> forces and occurrences and beings.</i>
<b>supernormal</b>	Beyond the range of the normal or scientifically explainable. <i>Years of <b>supernormal</b> employment during the war.</i>
<b>telepathic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of telepathy. <i>A team of <b>telepathic</b> superheroes who can read each other s thoughts.</i>

- transcendental** Existing outside of or not in accordance with nature-Aldous Huxley.  
*The **transcendental** importance of each person s soul.*
- with a sixth sense** Coming next after the fifth and just before the seventh in position.
- with second sight** Coming next after the first in position in space or time or degree or magnitude.

<b>conceptualize</b>	Have the idea for. <i>Sex was <b>conceptualized</b> as an overpowering force in the individual.</i>
<b>deranged</b>	Mad; insane. <i>A <b>deranged</b> gunman.</i>

<b>disbelieve</b>	Have no religious faith. <i>He seemed to <b>disbelieve</b> her.</i>
<b>extrasensory</b>	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.
<b><u>extraterrestrial</u></b>	Originating or located or occurring outside Earth or its atmosphere. <i>Searches for <b>extraterrestrial</b> intelligence.</i>
<b><u>ghost</u></b>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. <i>Being <b>ghosted</b> is one of the toughest ways to be dumped.</i>
<b><u>haunt</u></b>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. <i>She <b>haunts</b> the ballet.</i>
<b>hypnotism</b>	The study or practice of hypnosis.
<b>incapacity</b>	Legal disqualification. <i>They are not subject to any legal <b>incapacity</b>.</i>
<b>insight</b>	The clear (and often sudden) understanding of a complex situation. <i>The town offers some <b>insight</b> into Finnish rural life.</i>
<b>intuition</b>	An impression that something might be the case. <i>Your insights and <b>intuitions</b> as a native speaker are positively sought.</i>
<b>mesmerism</b>	The act of inducing hypnosis.
<b>paranormal</b>	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>A mystic who can prove he has <b>paranormal</b> powers.</i>
<b>parapsychology</b>	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
<b>psychiatric</b>	Relating to mental illness or its treatment. <i><b>Psychiatric</b> hospital.</i>
<b>psychoanalysis</b>	A system of psychological theory and therapy which aims to treat mental disorders by investigating the interaction of conscious and unconscious elements in the mind and bringing repressed fears and conflicts into the conscious mind by techniques such as dream interpretation and free association. <i>His physician recommended <b>psychoanalysis</b>.</i>
<b><u>psychological</u></b>	Mental or emotional as opposed to physical in nature. <i>Give <b>psychological</b> support.</i>
<b>psychologist</b>	A scientist trained in psychology. <i><b>Psychologists</b> are being called in to help employees cope with job losses.</i>
<b>psychotherapy</b>	The treatment of mental disorder by psychological rather than medical means.
<b>semiconscious</b>	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.

<b>sense</b>	Relating to or denoting a coding sequence of nucleotides complementary to an antisense sequence. <i>With the first frost they could <b>sense</b> a change in the days.</i>
<b>spirit</b>	Infuse with spirit. <i>The rule had been broken in <b>spirit</b> if not in letter.</i>
<u><b>subconscious</b></u>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. <i>My <b>subconscious</b> fear.</i>
<b>supernatural</b>	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. <i>A <b>supernatural</b> being.</i>
<b>telepathy</b>	Apparent communication from one mind to another without using sensory perceptions.
<u><b>trauma</b></u>	A deeply distressing or disturbing experience. <i>The event is relived with all the accompanying <b>trauma</b>.</i>
<u><b>visceral</b></u>	Relating to deep inward feelings rather than to the intellect. <i><b>Visceral</b> bleeding.</i>
