- *Of or relating to or determined by psychology.*

- *Relating to psychology.*



Synonyms of "Psychological" as an adjective (18 Words)

abstract

Dealing with a subject in the abstract without practical purpose or intention.

*The novel was too **abstract** and esoteric to sustain much attention.*

all in the mind

Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.

cerebral

Of or relating to the cerebrum or brain.

*A **cerebral** haemorrhage.*

cognitive

Relating to cognition.

*The **cognitive** processes involved in reading.*

conceptual

Relating to or based on mental concepts.

*The schizophrenic loses ability to abstract or do **conceptual** thinking.*

emotional

Of or pertaining to emotion.

*An **emotional** speech.*

in the mind

Currently fashionable.

inner

Innermost or essential.

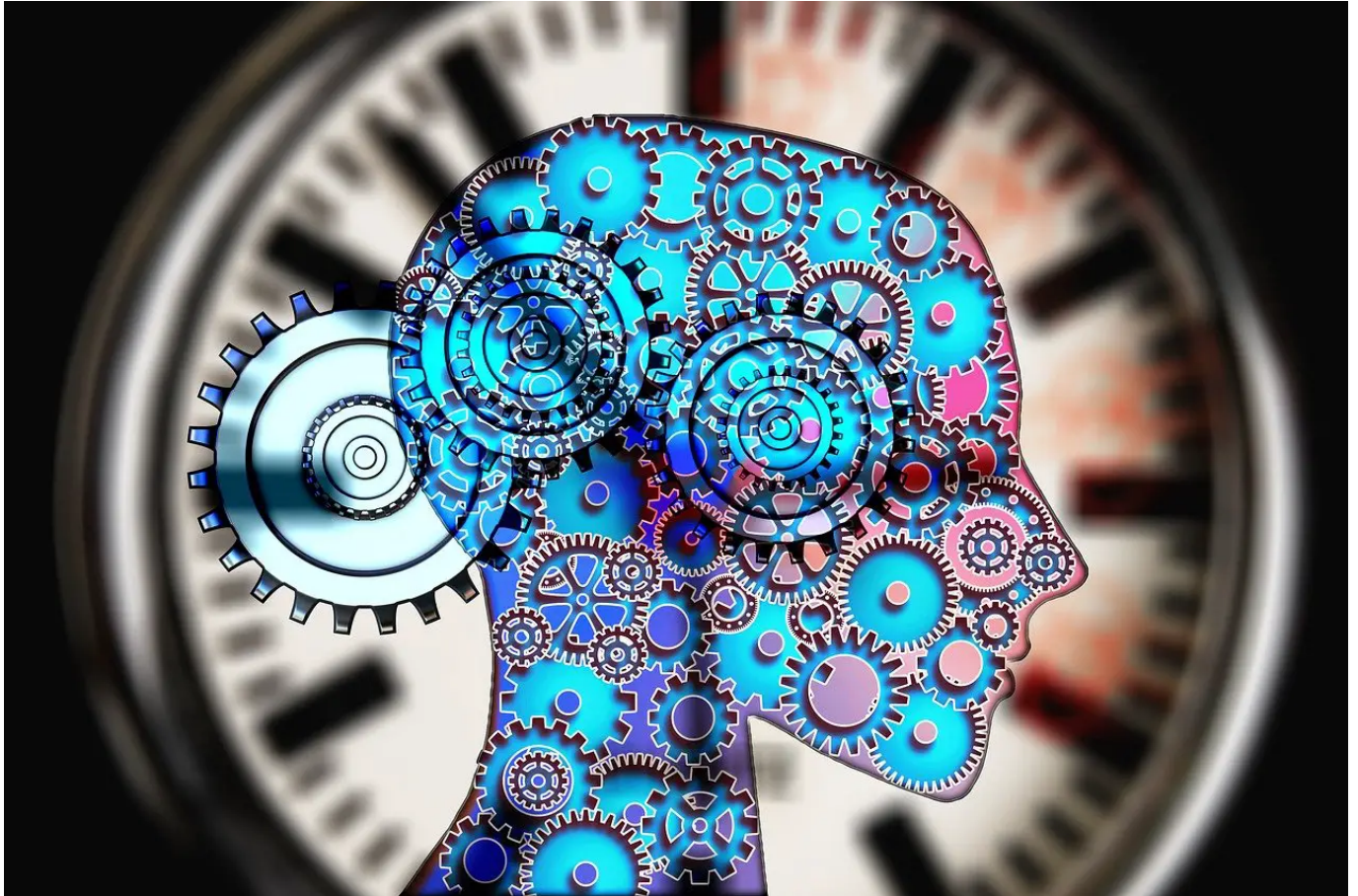

<u>intellectual</u>	Appealing to or using the intellect. <i>Intellectual problems.</i>
<u>irrational</u>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <i>Irrational numbers.</i>
<u>mental</u>	Relating to the mind. <i>I think he was a little worried that I might be mental.</i>
<u>psychosomatic</u>	(of a physical illness or other condition) caused or aggravated by a mental factor such as internal conflict or stress. <i>Hypnosis involves powerful but little understood psychosomatic interactions.</i>
<u>rational</u>	Able to think sensibly or logically. <i>The triumph of the rational over the animal side of man.</i>
<u>subconscious</u>	Of or concerning the part of the mind of which one is not fully aware but which influences one's actions and feelings. <i>My subconscious fear.</i>
<u>subjective</u>	Of a mental act performed entirely within the mind. <i>A subjective judgment.</i>
<u>subliminal</u>	Below the threshold of conscious perception.
<u>theoretical</u>	Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical considerations. <i>Theoretical science.</i>
<u>unconscious</u>	(followed by `of') not knowing or perceiving. <i>Happily unconscious of the new calamity at home.</i>

Associations of "Psychological" (30 Words)

affective	Denoting or relating to mental disorders in which disturbance of mood is the primary symptom. <i>Affective disorders.</i>
alertness	The process of paying close and continuous attention. <i>A lack of mental alertness.</i>
<u>amok</u>	In a murderous frenzy.
<u>cathartic</u>	Providing psychological relief through the open expression of strong emotions; causing catharsis. <i>Crying is a cathartic release.</i>
distortion	A shape resulting from distortion. <i>Heavy metal guitar players use vacuum tube amplifiers to produce extreme distortion.</i>

doubt	Consider unlikely or have doubts about. <i>Some doubt has been cast upon the authenticity of this account.</i>
genre	A style or category of art, music, or literature. <i>The science fiction genre.</i>
indecision	Doubt concerning two or more possible alternatives or courses of action. <i>Government indecision over the future of local taxation.</i>
maladjustment	Faulty adjustment, especially regarding finances. <i>Basic maladjustments in the cost structure.</i>
mental	Of or relating to the mind. <i>Mental illness.</i>
mentally	In a manner relating to the mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>
mood	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>Mood music.</i>
parapsychology	Phenomena that appear to contradict physical laws and suggest the possibility of causation by mental processes.
pathos	A style that has the power to evoke feelings. <i>The actor injects his customary humour and pathos into the role.</i>
psychic	The study of psychic phenomena. <i>Pier end palmists and fake psychics.</i>
psychologist	A scientist trained in psychology. <i>A leading child psychologist.</i>
psychology	The mental characteristics or attitude of a person or group. <i>The psychology of child killers.</i>
puzzling	Not clear to the understanding. <i>A puzzling statement.</i>
sensibility	Mental responsiveness and awareness. <i>Cruelty offended his sensibility.</i>
sentiment	The expression of a view or desire especially as formulated for a toast. <i>Many of the appeals rely on treacly sentiment.</i>
sentimental	Given to or marked by sentiment or sentimentality. <i>She felt a sentimental attachment to the place creep over her.</i>
suspense	A state or feeling of excited or anxious uncertainty about what may happen. <i>A tale of mystery and suspense.</i>
taut	(especially of muscles or nerves) tense; not relaxed. <i>The fabric stays taut without adhesive.</i>

telepathy	The supposed communication of thoughts or ideas by means other than the known senses.
thrill	Cause to be thrilled by some perceptual input. <i>A thrill of excitement ran through her.</i>
thriller	A novel, play, or film with an exciting plot, typically involving crime or espionage. <i>A tense thriller about a diamond heist that goes badly wrong.</i>
touched	Having come into contact. <i>The star said he was very touched to receive his medal.</i>
<u>trauma</u>	Any physical damage to the body caused by violence or accident or fracture etc. <i>A personal trauma like the death of a child.</i>
<u>traumatic</u>	Deeply disturbing or distressing. <i>She is remembering some deeply traumatic incident in her past.</i>
<u>uncertainty</u>	The state of being uncertain. <i>Times of uncertainty and danger.</i>
