- *An unstable and aggressive person.*

- maniac** A person suffering from mania.
*A religious **maniac**.*
- psychotic** A person afflicted with psychosis.

Associations of "Psychopath" (30 Words)

aggression	Deliberately unfriendly behavior. <i>The sheer volume and aggression of his playing.</i>
antisocial	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>Standoffish and antisocial.</i>
behaviour	(psychology) the aggregate of the responses or reactions or movements made by an organism in any situation. <i>Behaviour patterns.</i>
berserk	Out of control with anger or excitement; wild or frenzied. <i>A berserk worker smashing windows.</i>
crazy	Mad, especially as manifested in wild or aggressive behaviour. <i>The monument leant at a crazy angle.</i>
demented	Behaving irrationally due to anger, distress, or excitement. <i>She was demented with worry.</i>
deranged	Driven insane. <i>A deranged gunman.</i>
disaffected	Discontented as toward authority. <i>A military plot by disaffected elements in the army.</i>
disapproval	The expression of disapproval. <i>Jill replied with a hint of disapproval in her voice.</i>
disturbed	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i>The treatment of disturbed children.</i>
exhibitionist	A person who behaves in an extravagant way in order to attract attention. <i>I am something of an exhibitionist.</i>
fanatic	A person motivated by irrational enthusiasm (as for a cause). <i>Religious fanatics.</i>
furious	Marked by extreme anger. <i>Furious winds.</i>
illness	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>He died after a long illness.</i>
incongruous	Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. <i>A joke that was incongruous with polite conversation.</i>
insane	(of an action or quality) characterized or caused by madness. <i>A fly whose buzzing had been driving me insane.</i>

<u>lunatic</u>	An extremely foolish or eccentric person. <i>This lunatic just accelerated out from the side of the road.</i>
mad	Make someone mad. <i>Had I but seen thy picture in this plight it would have madded me.</i>
mentally	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>
narcissist	Someone in love with themselves. <i>Narcissists who think the world revolves around them.</i>
<u>rampage</u>	Act violently, recklessly, or destructively. <i>Youths went on the rampage and wrecked a classroom.</i>
raving	In a raving manner. <i>She'd never been a raving beauty.</i>
<u>reclusive</u>	Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude. <i>Sitting under the reclusive calm of a shade tree.</i>
<u>sociopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
unbalanced	(of a person) emotionally or mentally disturbed. <i>She considered him to be mentally unbalanced and dangerous.</i>
<u>unfriendly</u>	Not easy to understand or use. <i>She shot him an unfriendly glance.</i>
unsociable	Not conducive to friendly social relations. <i>An unsociable nature shy and reserved.</i>
unsocial	(of the hours of work of a job) falling outside the normal working day and thus socially inconvenient. <i>Mountain goats are relatively unsocial.</i>
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>Felt a violent dislike.</i>
<u>withdrawn</u>	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. <i>When her husband died she became very withdrawn.</i>
