- An unstable and aggressive person.

madman	A man who is mentally ill. Car got out of control some <b>madman</b> going too fast.
madwoman	A woman who is mentally ill. She d driven my father s convertible like a <b>madwoman</b> .
maniac	A person suffering from mania. A religious <b>maniac</b> .
psychotic	A person afflicted with psychosis.
<u>sociopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.

# Associations of "Psychopath" (30 Words)

aggression	Deliberately unfriendly behavior. The sheer volume and <b>aggression</b> of his playing.
antisocial	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. Standoffish and <b>antisocial</b> .
behaviour	(psychology) the aggregate of the responses or reactions or movements made by an organism in any situation. <b>Behaviour</b> patterns.
berserk	Out of control with anger or excitement; wild or frenzied. A <b>berserk</b> worker smashing windows.
crazy	Mad, especially as manifested in wild or aggressive behaviour. The monument leant at a <b>crazy</b> angle.
demented	Behaving irrationally due to anger, distress, or excitement. She was <b>demented</b> with worry.
<u>deranged</u>	Driven insane. A <b>deranged</b> gunman.
disaffected	Discontented as toward authority. A military plot by <b>disaffected</b> elements in the army.
<u>disapproval</u>	The expression of disapproval. Jill replied with a hint of <b>disapproval</b> in her voice.
disturbed	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i>The treatment of <b>disturbed</b> children.</i>
exhibitionist	A person who behaves in an extravagant way in order to attract attention. <i>I am something of an</i> <b>exhibitionist</b> .
fanatic	A person motivated by irrational enthusiasm (as for a cause. <i>Religious fanatics.</i>
furious	Marked by extreme anger. <i>Furious</i> winds.
<u>illness</u>	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>He died after a long <b>illness</b>.</i>
<u>incongruous</u>	Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. <i>A joke that was <b>incongruous</b> with polite conversation.</i>
<u>insane</u>	(of an action or quality) characterized or caused by madness. A fly whose buzzing had been driving me <b>insane</b> .



<u>lunatic</u>	An extremely foolish or eccentric person. This <b>lunatic</b> just accelerated out from the side of the road.
mad	Make someone mad. Had I but seen thy picture in this plight it would have <b>mad</b> ded me.
mentally	In your mind. Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.
narcissist	Someone in love with themselves. <i>Narcissists who think the world revolves around them.</i>
<u>rampage</u>	Act violently, recklessly, or destructively. Youths went on the <b>rampage</b> and wrecked a classroom.
raving	In a raving manner. She d never been a <b>raving</b> beauty.
<u>reclusive</u>	Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude. Sitting under the <b>reclusive</b> calm of a shade tree.
<u>sociopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
unbalanced	(of a person) emotionally or mentally disturbed. She considered him to be mentally <b>unbalanced</b> and dangerous.
<u>unfriendly</u>	Not easy to understand or use. She shot him an <b>unfriendly</b> glance.
unsociable	Not conducive to friendly social relations. An <b>unsociable</b> nature shy and reserved.
unsocial	(of the hours of work of a job) falling outside the normal working day and thus socially inconvenient. Mountain goats are relatively <b>unsocial</b> .
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>Felt a violent dislike.</i>
<u>withdrawn</u>	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. When her husband died she became very <b>withdrawn</b> .
