## **Published as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Published" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “published” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Formally made public.*
- *(of information) printed or made available online so as to be generally known.*
- *(of a writer) having had a work prepared and issued for public sale or readership.*
- *(of a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) prepared and issued for public sale or readership.*



### **Synonyms of "Published" as an adjective (1 Word)**

**promulgated** Formally made public.



## Usage Examples of "Published" as an adjective

- *The collection includes the complete published works of Benjamin Britten.*
- *Published accounts.*
- *Franco is also a published novelist and poet.*
- *Thirty-one published articles were reviewed for potential inclusion.*
- *There is very little published data on the subject.*
- *A course that offers the opportunity to have your writing critiqued by a published author.*



## Associations of "Published" (30 Words)

### [article](#)

The definite or indefinite article.  
*Small household **articles**.*

### [autobiography](#)

An account of a person's life written by that person.  
*He gives a vivid description of his childhood in his **autobiography**.*

### **biographical**

(of data or a written work) dealing with a particular person's life.  
***Biographical** information.*

### **biography**

An account of the series of events making up a person's life.  
*The basic difference of approach to **autobiography** and **biography**.*

### [book](#)

A literary composition that is published or intended for publication as a book.  
*The **book** of Isaiah.*

<b>coauthor</b>	A writer who collaborates with others in writing something.
<b>columnist</b>	A journalist contributing regularly to a newspaper or magazine.
<b>copier</b>	A machine that makes exact copies of something, especially documents, video or audio recordings, or software.
<b>correspondent</b>	Corresponding. <i>She wasn't much of a <b>correspondent</b>.</i>
<b>dictation</b>	Words that are dictated. <i>The job will involve taking <b>dictation</b> drafting letters and arranging meetings.</i>
<b>editor</b>	Computer science a program designed to perform such editorial functions as rearrangement or modification or deletion of data. <i>You will be able to use the <b>editor</b> to make any changes you want.</i>
<b><u>excerpt</u></b>	Take an excerpt or excerpts from a text. <i>She read out <b>excerpts</b> from an article in the Times.</i>
<b>extract</b>	Extract by the process of distillation. <i>The table is <b>extracted</b> from the report.</i>
<b><u>journal</u></b>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical <b>journals</b>.</i>
<b>journalism</b>	The product of the activity of journalism. <i>A collection of <b>journalism</b>.</i>
<b>journalist</b>	A person who writes for newspapers, magazines, or news websites or prepares news to be broadcast. <i>Foreign <b>journalists</b> had been expelled from the area.</i>
<b>magazine</b>	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He took the machine gun and a spare <b>magazine</b>.</i>
<b>memoir</b>	The proceedings of a learned society. <i>A revealing passage from Khrushchev's <b>memoirs</b>.</i>
<b>news</b>	Information reported in a newspaper or news magazine. <i>It was <b>news</b> to me.</i>
<b>newspaper</b>	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. <i>She left her muddy boots on a piece of <b>newspaper</b>.</i>
<b>novelist</b>	A writer of novels.
<b>photojournalism</b>	Journalism that presents a story primarily through the use of pictures.
<b>poet</b>	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>

<b>print</b>	Put into print. <i>The <b>print</b> unions.</i>
<b>publisher</b>	A company or person that prepares and issues books, journals, or music for sale. <i>A commercial music <b>publisher</b>.</i>
<b>reporter</b>	A person who investigates and reports or edits news stories.
<b>reporting</b>	The news as presented by reporters for newspapers or radio or television.
<u><a href="#">scribe</a></u>	Mark with a pointed instrument. <i>He <b>scribed</b> a note that he passed to Dan.</i>
<b>travelogue</b>	A film, book, or illustrated lecture about the places visited by or experiences of a traveller.
<u><a href="#">writer</a></u>	A person who has written something or who writes in a particular way. <i>A CD <b>writer</b>.</i>
