Definitions of "Published" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “published” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Formally made public.*
- *(of information) printed or made available online so as to be generally known.*
- *(of a writer) having had a work prepared and issued for public sale or readership.*
- *(of a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) prepared and issued for public sale or readership.*



Synonyms of "Published" as an adjective (1 Word)

*The **book** of Isaiah.*

| dictation | Words that are dictated. <i>The job will involve taking dictation drafting letters and arranging meetings.</i> |
| editor | Computer science a program designed to perform such editorial functions as rearrangement or modification or deletion of data. <i>You will be able to use the editor to make any changes you want.</i> |
| <u>excerpt</u> | Take an excerpt or excerpts from a text. <i>She read out excerpts from an article in the Times.</i> |
| extract | Extract by the process of distillation. <i>The table is extracted from the report.</i> |
| <u>journal</u> | Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical journals.</i> |
| journalism | The product of the activity of journalism. <i>A collection of journalism.</i> |
| journalist | A person who writes for newspapers, magazines, or news websites or prepares news to be broadcast. <i>Foreign journalists had been expelled from the area.</i> |
| magazine | A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He took the machine gun and a spare magazine.</i> |
| memoir | The proceedings of a learned society. <i>A revealing passage from Khrushchev's memoirs.</i> |
| news | Information reported in a newspaper or news magazine. <i>It was news to me.</i> |
| newspaper | The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. <i>She left her muddy boots on a piece of newspaper.</i> |
| novelist | A writer of novels. |
| photojournalism | Journalism that presents a story primarily through the use of pictures. |
| poet | A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i> |
