#### Definitions of "Published" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "published" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Formally made public.
- (of information) printed or made available online so as to be generally known.
- (of a writer) having had a work prepared and issued for public sale or readership.
- (of a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) prepared and issued for public sale or readership.

**promulgated** Formally made public.

- The collection includes the complete published works of Benjamin Britten.
- Published accounts.
- Franco is also a published novelist and poet.

# Associations of "Published" (30 Words)

<u>article</u>	The definite or indefinite article. Small household <b>article</b> s.
<u>autobiography</u>	An account of a person's life written by that person. <i>He gives a vivid description of his childhood in his <b>autobiography</b>.</i>
biographical	(of data or a written work) dealing with a particular person's life. <b>Biographical</b> information.
biography	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. The basic difference of approach to auto <b>biography</b> and <b>biography</b> .
<u>book</u>	A literary composition that is published or intended for publication as a book. The <b>book</b> of Isaiah.



coauthor	A writer who collaborates with others in writing something.
columnist	A journalist contributing regularly to a newspaper or magazine.
copier	A machine that makes exact copies of something, especially documents, video or audio recordings, or software.
correspondent	Corresponding. She wasn t much of a <b>correspondent</b> .
dictation	Words that are dictated. The job will involve taking <b>dictation</b> drafting letters and arranging meetings.
editor	Computer science a program designed to perform such editorial functions as rearrangement or modification or deletion of data. You will be able to use the <b>editor</b> to make any changes you want.
<u>excerpt</u>	Take an excerpt or excerpts from a text. She read out <b>excerpt</b> s from an article in the Times.
extract	Extract by the process of distillation. The table is <b>extract</b> ed from the report.
<u>journal</u>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical <b>journal</b>s.</i>
journalism	The product of the activity of journalism. A collection of <b>journalism</b> .
journalist	A person who writes for newspapers, magazines, or news websites or prepares news to be broadcast. Foreign <b>journalist</b> s had been expelled from the area.
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He took the machine gun and a spare <b>magazine</b>.</i>
memoir	The proceedings of a learned society. A revealing passage from Khrushchev s <b>memoir</b> s.
news	Information reported in a newspaper or news magazine. <i>It was <b>news</b> to me.</i>
newspaper	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. She left her muddy boots on a piece of <b>newspaper</b> .
novelist	A writer of novels.
photojournalism	Journalism that presents a story primarily through the use of pictures.
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more <b>poet</b> than academic because of his gift for language.</i>



print	Put into print. <i>The <b>print</b> unions.</i>
publisher	A company or person that prepares and issues books, journals, or music for sale. <i>A commercial music <b>publisher</b></i> .
reporter	A person who investigates and reports or edits news stories.
reporting	The news as presented by reporters for newspapers or radio or television.
<u>scribe</u>	Mark with a pointed instrument. He <b>scribe</b> d a note that he passed to Dan.
travelogue	A film, book, or illustrated lecture about the places visited by or experiences of a traveller.
<u>writer</u>	A person who has written something or who writes in a particular way. <i>A CD writer</i> .
