Definitions of "Published" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "published" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Formally made public.
- (of information) printed or made available online so as to be generally known.
- (of a writer) having had a work prepared and issued for public sale or readership.
- (of a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) prepared and issued for public sale or readership.

Associations of "Published" (30 Words)

<u>article</u>	The definite or indefinite article. Small household article s.
<u>autobiography</u>	An account of a person's life written by that person. <i>He gives a vivid description of his childhood in his autobiography.</i>
biographical	(of data or a written work) dealing with a particular person's life. Biographical information.
biography	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. The basic difference of approach to auto biography and biography .
<u>book</u>	A literary composition that is published or intended for publication as a book. The book of Isaiah.



coauthor	A writer who collaborates with others in writing something.
columnist	A journalist contributing regularly to a newspaper or magazine.
copier	A machine that makes exact copies of something, especially documents, video or audio recordings, or software.
correspondent	Corresponding. She wasn t much of a correspondent .
dictation	Words that are dictated. The job will involve taking dictation drafting letters and arranging meetings.
editor	Computer science a program designed to perform such editorial functions as rearrangement or modification or deletion of data. You will be able to use the editor to make any changes you want.
<u>excerpt</u>	Take an excerpt or excerpts from a text. She read out excerpt s from an article in the Times.
extract	Extract by the process of distillation. The table is extract ed from the report.
<u>journal</u>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical journals.</i>
journalism	The product of the activity of journalism. A collection of journalism .
journalist	A person who writes for newspapers, magazines, or news websites or prepares news to be broadcast. Foreign journalist s had been expelled from the area.
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He took the machine gun and a spare magazine.</i>
memoir	The proceedings of a learned society. A revealing passage from Khrushchev s memoir s.
news	Information reported in a newspaper or news magazine. <i>It was news to me.</i>
newspaper	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. She left her muddy boots on a piece of newspaper .
novelist	A writer of novels.
photojournalism	Journalism that presents a story primarily through the use of pictures.
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i>



print	Put into print. <i>The print unions.</i>
publisher	A company or person that prepares and issues books, journals, or music for sale. <i>A commercial music publisher</i> .
reporter	A person who investigates and reports or edits news stories.
reporting	The news as presented by reporters for newspapers or radio or television.
<u>scribe</u>	Mark with a pointed instrument. He scribe d a note that he passed to Dan.
travelogue	A film, book, or illustrated lecture about the places visited by or experiences of a traveller.
<u>writer</u>	A person who has written something or who writes in a particular way. <i>A CD writer</i> .
