## **Pumped as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Pumped" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pumped” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of an inflatable object) filled up with air, especially by using a pump.*
- *(of milk) drawn from the breast using a breast pump, typically in order to feed a baby by means of a bottle.*
- *Very enthusiastic or excited.*
- *Tense with excitement and enthusiasm as from a rush of adrenaline.*



## Synonyms of "Pumped" as an adjective (2 Words)

- pumped-up** Tense with excitement and enthusiasm as from a rush of adrenaline.  
(of a device or network) using wires or cables rather than wireless technology to transmit signals.
- wired** *Wired* bundles of newspapers.

- *I was so pumped that I overdid everything.*

<b>air</b>	Expose to cool or cold air so as to cool or freshen. <i>An <b>air</b> sign.</i>
<b>atomizer</b>	A device for emitting water, perfume, or other liquids as a fine spray. <i>Spray the bouquet with water from an <b>atomizer</b> to keep it fresh.</i>
<b>cleaner</b>	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>My suit s at the <b>cleaners</b>.</i>
<b>cleanup</b>	The act of making something clean.
<b>conduit</b>	A person or organization that acts as a channel for the transmission of something. <i>The gas pipe should not be close to any electrical <b>conduit</b>.</i>
<b>diesel</b>	A heavy petroleum fraction used as fuel in diesel engines. <i>A <b>diesel</b> locomotive.</i>
<b>emptiness</b>	The state of containing nothing. <i>He realizes the <b>emptiness</b> of his statement.</i>
<b>empty</b>	Make void or empty of contents. <i>After the violent argument he felt <b>empty</b>.</i>
<b>engine</b>	A fire engine. <i>A siege <b>engine</b>.</i>
<b>exhaust</b>	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>The country has <b>exhausted</b> its treasury reserves.</i>
<b>fluid</b>	A substance that is fluid at room temperature and pressure. <i>Body <b>fluids</b>.</i>
<b>fumes</b>	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
<b>generator</b>	An apparatus that produces a vapor or gas. <i>He was the <b>generator</b> of several complaints.</i>
<b>hollow</b>	As if echoing in a hollow space. <i>The <b>hollow</b> sound of footsteps in the empty ballroom.</i>
<b>hose</b>	Water or spray with a hose. <i><b>Hose</b> the lawn.</i>
<b>hydraulic</b>	Of or relating to the study of hydraulics. <i><b>Hydraulic</b> fluid.</i>
<b>hypodermic</b>	A piston syringe that is fitted with a hypodermic needle for giving injections. <i>The <b>hypodermics</b> left strewn around the piazza.</i>
<b>inhale</b>	Eat (food) greedily or rapidly. <i>Later on I <b>inhale</b> a box of chocolate cookies while watching cable TV.</i>

<b>inject</b>	Inject oneself with a narcotic drug especially habitually. <i>She tried to <b>inject</b> scorn into her tone.</i>
<b>insulin</b>	An animal derived or synthetic form of insulin used to treat diabetes.
<b>motor</b>	Relating to motor vehicles. <i>He had <b>motored</b> along to second base on a passed ball.</i>
<b>siphon</b>	Convey draw off or empty by or as if by a siphon. <i>A piece of tubing was used to <b>siphon</b> petrol.</i>
<b>suction</b>	Remove something using suction. <i>Physicians used a tube to <b>suction</b> out the gallstones.</i>
<b>syringe</b>	Spray or irrigate a body part with a syringe. <i>I had my ears <b>syringed</b>.</i>
<b>tube</b>	A cathode ray tube especially in a television set. <i>We <b>tubed</b> down the river on a hot summer day.</i>
<b>turbine</b>	Rotary engine in which the kinetic energy of a moving fluid is converted into mechanical energy by causing a bladed rotor to rotate.
<b>vacancy</b>	Being unoccupied. <i>Cathy stared into <b>vacancy</b> seeing nothing.</i>
<b>vaccinate</b>	Treat (someone) with a vaccine to produce immunity against a disease. <i>The nurse <b>vaccinated</b> the children in the school.</i>
<b>vacuum</b>	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. <i>The room needs to be <b>vacuumed</b>.</i>
<b><u>void</u></b>	Not valid or legally binding. <i><b>Void</b> spaces surround the tanks.</i>
