- Very enthusiastic or excited.
- Tense with excitement and enthusiasm as from a rush of adrenaline.

air	Expose to cool or cold air so as to cool or freshen. An air sign.
atomizer	A device for emitting water, perfume, or other liquids as a fine spray. Spray the bouquet with water from an atomizer to keep it fresh.
<u>cleaner</u>	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. My suit s at the cleaner s.
<u>cleanup</u>	The act of making something clean.
conduit	A person or organization that acts as a channel for the transmission of something. The gas pipe should not be close to any electrical conduit .
diesel	A heavy petroleum fraction used as fuel in diesel engines. A diesel locomotive.
<u>emptiness</u>	The state of containing nothing. <i>He realizes the emptiness of his statement.</i>
<u>empty</u>	Make void or empty of contents. After the violent argument he felt empty .
<u>engine</u>	A fire engine. A siege engine .
<u>exhaust</u>	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>The country has</i> exhaust ed its treasury reserves.
<u>fluid</u>	A substance that is fluid at room temperature and pressure. <i>Body fluids.</i>
fumes	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
<u>generator</u>	An apparatus that produces a vapor or gas. <i>He was the generator of several complaints.</i>
hollow	As if echoing in a hollow space. The hollow sound of footsteps in the empty ballroom.
hose	Water or spray with a hose. <i>Hose</i> the lawn.
hydraulic	Of or relating to the study of hydraulics. <i>Hydraulic fluid</i> .
hypodermic	A piston syringe that is fitted with a hypodermic needle for giving injections. <i>The</i> hypodermic <i>s left strewn around the piazza.</i>
inhale	Eat (food) greedily or rapidly. Later on I inhale a box of chocolate cookies while watching cable TV.



inject	Inject oneself with a narcotic drug especially habitually. She tried to inject scorn into her tone.
insulin	An animal derived or synthetic form of insulin used to treat diabetes.
motor	Relating to motor vehicles. He had motor ed along to second base on a passed ball.
siphon	Convey draw off or empty by or as if by a siphon. A piece of tubing was used to siphon petrol.
suction	Remove something using suction. Physicians used a tube to suction out the gallstones.
syringe	Spray or irrigate a body part with a syringe. I had my ears syringe d.
tube	A cathode ray tube especially in a television set. We tube d down the river on a hot summer day.
turbine	Rotary engine in which the kinetic energy of a moving fluid is converted into mechanical energy by causing a bladed rotor to rotate.
vacancy	Being unoccupied. Cathy stared into vacancy seeing nothing.
vaccinate	Treat (someone) with a vaccine to produce immunity against a disease. The nurse vaccinate d the children in the school.
vacuum	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. The room needs to be vacuum ed.
<u>void</u>	Not valid or legally binding. Void spaces surround the tanks.
