Pumped as an Adjective

Definitions of "Pumped" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pumped” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of an inflatable object) filled up with air, especially by using a pump.*
- *(of milk) drawn from the breast using a breast pump, typically in order to feed a baby by means of a bottle.*
- *Very enthusiastic or excited.*
- *Tense with excitement and enthusiasm as from a rush of adrenaline.*



Synonyms of "Pumped" as an adjective (2 Words)

- pumped-up** Tense with excitement and enthusiasm as from a rush of adrenaline.
(of a device or network) using wires or cables rather than wireless technology to transmit signals.
- wired** ***Wired** bundles of newspapers.*

- *He was so pumped he couldn't sleep.*
- *We were really pumped up for the race.*
- *The team came out really pumped up.*
- *Mouth-inflated balloons are softer than pumped balloons.*
- *Each wheelbarrow has a pumped up tyre ensuring a smooth ride.*
- *I was so pumped that I overdid everything.*

air	Expose to cool or cold air so as to cool or freshen. <i>An air sign.</i>
atomizer	A device for emitting water, perfume, or other liquids as a fine spray. <i>Spray the bouquet with water from an atomizer to keep it fresh.</i>
cleaner	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>My suit s at the cleaners.</i>
cleanup	The act of making something clean.
conduit	A person or organization that acts as a channel for the transmission of something. <i>The gas pipe should not be close to any electrical conduit.</i>
diesel	A heavy petroleum fraction used as fuel in diesel engines. <i>A diesel locomotive.</i>
emptiness	The state of containing nothing. <i>He realizes the emptiness of his statement.</i>
empty	Make void or empty of contents. <i>After the violent argument he felt empty.</i>
engine	A fire engine. <i>A siege engine.</i>
exhaust	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>The country has exhausted its treasury reserves.</i>
fluid	A substance that is fluid at room temperature and pressure. <i>Body fluids.</i>
fumes	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
generator	An apparatus that produces a vapor or gas. <i>He was the generator of several complaints.</i>
hollow	As if echoing in a hollow space. <i>The hollow sound of footsteps in the empty ballroom.</i>
hose	Water or spray with a hose. <i>Hose the lawn.</i>
hydraulic	Of or relating to the study of hydraulics. <i>Hydraulic fluid.</i>
hypodermic	A piston syringe that is fitted with a hypodermic needle for giving injections. <i>The hypodermics left strewn around the piazza.</i>
inhale	Eat (food) greedily or rapidly. <i>Later on I inhale a box of chocolate cookies while watching cable TV.</i>

inject	Inject oneself with a narcotic drug especially habitually. <i>She tried to inject scorn into her tone.</i>
insulin	An animal derived or synthetic form of insulin used to treat diabetes.
motor	Relating to motor vehicles. <i>He had motored along to second base on a passed ball.</i>
siphon	Convey draw off or empty by or as if by a siphon. <i>A piece of tubing was used to siphon petrol.</i>
suction	Remove something using suction. <i>Physicians used a tube to suction out the gallstones.</i>
syringe	Spray or irrigate a body part with a syringe. <i>I had my ears syringed.</i>
tube	A cathode ray tube especially in a television set. <i>We tubed down the river on a hot summer day.</i>
turbine	Rotary engine in which the kinetic energy of a moving fluid is converted into mechanical energy by causing a bladed rotor to rotate.
vacancy	Being unoccupied. <i>Cathy stared into vacancy seeing nothing.</i>
vaccinate	Treat (someone) with a vaccine to produce immunity against a disease. <i>The nurse vaccinated the children in the school.</i>
vacuum	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. <i>The room needs to be vacuumed.</i>
<u>void</u>	Not valid or legally binding. <i>Void spaces surround the tanks.</i>
