prompt (of a person) acting without delay.

Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation.

These toys are not **suitable** for children under five.

Before a time limit expires.

timely A timely warning.

well timed In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

when expected Considered likely or probable to happen or arrive.
