<b>blameless</b>	Innocent of wrongdoing. <i>Has lived a <b>blameless</b> life.</i>
<a href="#"><b>blizzard</b></a>	A severe snowstorm with high winds. <i>A <b>blizzard</b> of lawsuits.</i>
<a href="#"><b>chaste</b></a>	Abstaining from extramarital, or from all, sexual intercourse. <i>A <b>chaste</b> consoling embrace.</i>
<b>clean</b>	Clean one's body or parts thereof as by washing. <i>A <b>clean</b> sweep.</i>
<a href="#"><b>cloud</b></a>	Make overcast or cloudy. <i>The only <b>cloud</b> on the horizon was the possibility of dissent by the French.</i>
<a href="#"><b>covered</b></a>	Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form. <i>Women with <b>covered</b> faces.</i>
<a href="#"><b>flawless</b></a>	Without a flaw. <i>Her smooth <b>flawless</b> skin.</i>
<a href="#"><b>hail</b></a>	Hail falls. <i>It <b>hailed</b> so hard we had to stop.</i>
<a href="#"><b>immaculate</b></a>	Uniformly coloured without spots or other marks. <i>An <b>immaculate</b> safety record.</i>
<b>immiscible</b>	Incapable of mixing. <i>Benzene is <b>immiscible</b> with water.</i>
<b>impeccable</b>	Not capable of sin. <i>Speaks <b>impeccable</b> French.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	The quality of innocent naivete. <i>The trial established his <b>innocence</b>.</i>

<b>innocent</b>	A person involved by chance in a situation, especially a victim of crime or war. <i><b>Innocent</b> of literary merit.</i>
<b>lowering</b>	The act of causing to become less. <i>The painting depicts the <b>lowering</b> of the Count's body into his tomb.</i>
<b>precipitation</b>	The quantity of water falling to earth at a specific place within a specified period of time. <i>Cora was already regretting her <b>precipitation</b>.</i>
<u><b>pristine</b></u>	Immaculately clean and unused. <i>A <b>pristine</b> white shirt.</i>
<b>purist</b>	Someone who insists on great precision and correctness (especially in the use of words). <i><b>Purist</b> fans of the original comic strip.</i>
<u><b>purity</b></u>	A woman's virtue or chastity. <i>The <b>purity</b> of our drinking water.</i>
<b>sinless</b>	Free from sin. <i>The <b>sinless</b> life of Christ.</i>
<b>sleet</b>	Sleet falls. <i>It was <b>sleeting</b> so hard we could barely see.</i>
<b>snowy</b>	Of the white color of snow. <i>A long <b>snowy</b> winter.</i>
<u><b>spotless</b></u>	Absolutely clean or pure; immaculate. <i><b>Spotless</b> behaviour is seemingly the norm in his organization.</i>
<b>uncontaminated</b>	Not contaminated. <i><b>Uncontaminated</b> air and food.</i>
<b>unimpeachable</b>	Not able to be doubted, questioned, or criticized; entirely trustworthy. <i>An <b>unimpeachable</b> reputation.</i>
<b>unmixed</b>	Not mixed. <i>Bold <b>unmixed</b> colours.</i>
<b>unspotted</b>	Without soil or spot or stain. <i>The network of avian enthusiasts ensures that no rarity goes <b>unspotted</b>.</i>
<u><b>untainted</b></u>	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>The island remains virtually <b>untainted</b> by commercialism.</i>
<u><b>virtuous</b></u>	Chaste (typically used of a woman). <i>She considered herself very <b>virtuous</b> because she neither drank nor smoked.</i>

<b>white</b>	The player of the white pieces in chess or draughts. <i>Lips <b>white</b> with terror.</i>
<b>wintry</b>	Characteristic of or occurring in winter. <i>Brown <b>wintry</b> grasses.</i>
