<b>honor</b>	The state of being honored. <i>A man of <b>honor</b>.</i>
<b>honour</b>	A course of degree studies more specialized than for an ordinary pass. <i>Mrs Young had the <b>honour</b> of being received by the Queen.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	A state or condition of being innocent of a specific crime or offense. <i>The healthy bloom in her cheeks gave her an aura of <b>innocence</b>.</i>
<b>integrity</b>	Internal consistency or lack of corruption in electronic data. <i>He expects to find in us the common honesty and <b>integrity</b> of men of business.</i>
<b>lack of corruption</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>lack of pollution</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>morality</b>	Concern with the distinction between good and evil or right and wrong; right or good conduct. <i>A bourgeois <b>morality</b>.</i>

<b>nobility of soul</b>	The state of being of noble birth.
<b>nobility of spirit</b>	The state of being of noble birth.
<b>piety</b>	Righteousness by virtue of being pious. <i>Acts of <b>piety</b> and charity.</i>
<b>pureness</b>	A woman's virtue or chastity.
<b>rectitude</b>	Morally correct behaviour or thinking; righteousness. <i>Mattie is a model of <b>rectitude</b>.</i>
<b>righteousness</b>	Adhering to moral principles. <i>We had little doubt about the <b>righteousness</b> of our cause.</i>
<b>saintliness</b>	The quality of resembling a saint. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on <b>saintliness</b>.</i>
<b>sinlessness</b>	The state of being unsullied by sin or moral wrong; lacking a knowledge of evil.
<b>uprightness</b>	The condition or quality of being honourable or honest; rectitude. <i>There is a general lack of <b>uprightness</b> in these postmodern times.</i>
<b>virtue</b>	Morality with respect to sexual relations. <i>Mike was extolling the <b>virtues</b> of the car.</i>
<b>virtuousness</b>	The quality of doing what is right and avoiding what is wrong.
<b>whiteness</b>	United States educator who in 1865 (with Ezra Cornell) founded Cornell University and served as its first president (1832-1918). <i>Only the <b>whiteness</b> of her cheeks gave any indication of the stress from which she was suffering.</i>
<b>worthiness</b>	The quality or state of having merit or value. <i>Doubts about the <b>worthiness</b> of writing novels.</i>

<a href="#">antiseptic</a>	An antiseptic compound or preparation. <i>The <b>antiseptic</b> effect of alcohol.</i>
<a href="#">assay</a>	Determine the biochemical or immunological activity of (a sample). <i>Each <b>assay</b> was performed in duplicate.</i>
<b>blameless</b>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>He led a <b>blameless</b> life.</i>
<b>chastity</b>	Morality with respect to sexual relations. <i>Vows of <b>chastity</b>.</i>
<b>clean</b>	Make clean remove dirt marks or stains from. <i>We are not completely sure that the elections will be <b>clean</b> and fair.</i>
<a href="#">cleanliness</a>	The state or quality of being clean or being kept clean. <i>She had an obsession with personal <b>cleanliness</b> and spent much of her time in the bathroom.</i>

<b>diaper</b>	A fabric (usually cotton or linen) with a distinctive woven pattern of small repeated figures.
<b>disinfect</b>	Destroy microorganisms or pathogens by cleansing. <i>Chlorine has been used to <b>disinfect</b> water in pools for many years.</i>
<b>disinfection</b>	The process of cleaning something, especially with a chemical, in order to destroy bacteria. <i>Instruments must undergo high level <b>disinfection</b> before reuse.</i>
<b>fumigate</b>	Treat with fumes, expose to fumes, especially with the aim of disinfecting or eradicating pests. <i>We got sulphur candles to <b>fumigate</b> the house.</i>
<b>guiltless</b>	Having no guilt; innocent. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself <b>guiltless</b> in this.</i>
<b>honour</b>	A title of respect or form of address given to a circuit judge, a US mayor, and (in Irish or rustic speech) any person of rank. <i>Mrs Young had the <b>honour</b> of being received by the Queen.</i>
<b>hygiene</b>	Conditions or practices conducive to maintaining health and preventing disease, especially through cleanliness. <i>Personal <b>hygiene</b>.</i>
<b>hygienic</b>	Tending to promote or preserve health. <i><b>Hygienic</b> surroundings with plenty of fresh air.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	The quality of innocent naivete. <i>The trial established his <b>innocence</b>.</i>
<b>innocent</b>	The young children killed by Herod after the birth of Jesus (Matt. 2:16). <i>She is a poor <b>innocent</b> young creature.</i>
<b>irreproachable</b>	Beyond criticism; faultless. <i>Of <b>irreproachable</b> character.</i>
<b>naivete</b>	Lack of sophistication or worldliness. <i>His greatest fault was his political naïvet.</i>
<b>pristine</b>	Clean and fresh as if new; spotless. <i>Handed her his <b>pristine</b> white handkerchief.</i>
<b>sanitary</b>	Free from filth and pathogens. <i>A <b>sanitary</b> washroom.</i>
<b>sanitation</b>	Conditions relating to public health, especially the provision of clean drinking water and adequate sewage disposal. <i>They could afford to erect new dwellings with a reasonable standard of construction and <b>sanitation</b>.</i>

<b>shy</b>	Lacking self-confidence. <i>Don't <b>shy</b> away from saying what you think.</i>
<b>sinless</b>	Free from sin. <i>The <b>sinless</b> life of Christ.</i>
<b>sterilize</b>	Make infertile. <i>In some countries people with genetically transmissible disabilities are <b>sterilized</b>.</i>
<b>toilet</b>	A room building or cubicle containing a toilet or toilets. <i>A public <b>toilet</b>.</i>
<b>unimpeachable</b>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>An <b>unimpeachable</b> witness.</i>
<b>unspotted</b>	Without soil or spot or stain. <i>The network of avian enthusiasts ensures that no rarity goes <b>unspotted</b>.</i>
<b>unstained</b>	Not having a coating of stain or varnish. <i>An apron keeps his clothing <b>unstained</b>.</i>
<b><u>untainted</u></b>	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>The island remains virtually <b>untainted</b> by commercialism.</i>
<b>washing</b>	The action of washing oneself or laundering clothes bed linen etc. <i>Avoid over enthusiastic <b>washing</b>.</i>
