<u>compass</u>	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it. Crewe was ideally placed on the rail network with connections running to all points of the <b>compass</b> .
<u>horizon</u>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>The sun rose above the</i> <b>horizon</b> .
<u>orbit</u>	One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He s out of my <b>orbit</b>.</i>



outlook	The prospect for the future. <i>He had a practical <b>outlook</b> on life.</i>
perception	Awareness of something through the senses. <i>He wouldn t have accepted said my mother with unusual <b>perception</b>.</i>
perspective	A view or prospect. A trick of <b>perspective</b> .
range of experience	The limit of capability.
<u>scope</u>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. Infrared night <b>scope</b> s.
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Political reforms to match those in the economic <b>sphere</b>.</i>
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>They look the same in outward view</i> .

### Usage Examples of "Purview" as a noun

- Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the purview of women generally.
- Such a case might be within the purview of the legislation.

<u>across</u>	To the opposite side. A crater some 30 metres <b>across</b> .
axis	The central column of an inflorescence or other growth. <i>The Anglo American <b>axis</b>.</i>
boundary	A line which marks the limits of an area; a dividing line. A <b>boundary</b> wall.
<u>broaden</u>	Expand to encompass more people or things. <i>He has to <b>broaden</b> Labour s appeal to the whole community.</i>
crossbar	A horizontal bar that goes across something.

<u>horizon</u>	A great circle of the celestial sphere the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place. <i>The upper horizon of the site showed an arrangement of two rows of</i> <i>features.</i>
horizontal	A horizontal line plane etc. A <b>horizontal</b> line.
incompleteness	The state of being crude and incomplete and imperfect. The study was criticized for <b>incompleteness</b> of data but it stimulated further research.
insofar	To the degree or extent that. <b>Insofar</b> as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>He clutched a <b>jag</b> of the rock.</i>
localized	Made local or oriented locally. A decentralized and <b>localized</b> political authority.
longitudinal	(of research or data) involving information about an individual or group gathered over a period of time. <i>Longitudinal</i> positions.
<u>monopoly</u>	A board game in which players try to gain a monopoly on real estate as pieces advance around the board according to the throw of a die. A <b>monopoly</b> on silver.
<u>only</u>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. Call me <b>only</b> if your cold gets worse.
orientation	A person's awareness of self with regard to position and time and place and personal relationships. <i>Recent research in animal orientation.</i>
prospect	Chances or opportunities for success or wealth. There was no <b>prospect</b> of a reconciliation.



Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc. We didn t want to <b>purvey</b> gloom and doom.
Restricted in meaning as e g man in a tall man. <i>Of <b>restricted</b> importance.</i>
Take sides for or against. A <b>side</b> dish of fresh vegetables.
Put a new sole on. <i>Sole</i> rights of publication.
Extending or lying across; in a crosswise direction; at right angles to the long axis. A <b>transverse</b> beam supports the dashboard.
(of an action or decision) performed by or affecting only one person, group, or country involved in a situation, without the agreement of another or the others. A <b>unilateral</b> decision.
