ambit	An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control. <i>The ambit of municipal legislation.</i>
compass	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it. <i>Crewe was ideally placed on the rail network with connections running to all points of the compass.</i>
horizon	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>The sun rose above the horizon.</i>
orbit	One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He s out of my orbit.</i>

outlook	The prospect for the future. <i>He had a practical outlook on life.</i>
perception	Awareness of something through the senses. <i>He wouldn't have accepted said my mother with unusual perception.</i>
perspective	A view or prospect. <i>A trick of perspective.</i>
range of experience	The limit of capability.
scope	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Infrared night scopes.</i>
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Political reforms to match those in the economic sphere.</i>
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>They look the same in outward view.</i>

Usage Examples of "Purview" as a noun

- *Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the purview of women generally.*
- *Such a case might be within the purview of the legislation.*

across	To the opposite side. <i>A crater some 30 metres across.</i>
axis	The central column of an inflorescence or other growth. <i>The Anglo American axis.</i>
boundary	A line which marks the limits of an area; a dividing line. <i>A boundary wall.</i>
broaden	Expand to encompass more people or things. <i>He has to broaden Labour's appeal to the whole community.</i>
crossbar	A horizontal bar that goes across something.
edge	Strike the ball with the edge of the bat strike a ball delivered by the bowler with the edge of the bat. <i>He rounded the edges of the box.</i>

<u>exclusive</u>	Catering for or available to only a few, select customers; high class and expensive. <i>Prices are exclusive of VAT.</i>
<u>facet</u>	A distinct feature or element in a problem. <i>A philosophy that extends to all facets of the business.</i>
finite	Limited in size or extent. <i>Every computer has a finite amount of memory.</i>
<u>horizon</u>	A great circle of the celestial sphere the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place. <i>The upper horizon of the site showed an arrangement of two rows of features.</i>
horizontal	A horizontal line plane etc. <i>A horizontal line.</i>
incompleteness	The state of being crude and incomplete and imperfect. <i>The study was criticized for incompleteness of data but it stimulated further research.</i>
insofar	To the degree or extent that. <i>Insofar as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.</i>
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>He clutched a jag of the rock.</i>
localized	Made local or oriented locally. <i>A decentralized and localized political authority.</i>
longitudinal	(of research or data) involving information about an individual or group gathered over a period of time. <i>Longitudinal positions.</i>
<u>monopoly</u>	A board game in which players try to gain a monopoly on real estate as pieces advance around the board according to the throw of a die. <i>A monopoly on silver.</i>
<u>only</u>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>Call me only if your cold gets worse.</i>
orientation	A person's awareness of self with regard to position and time and place and personal relationships. <i>Recent research in animal orientation.</i>
prospect	Chances or opportunities for success or wealth. <i>There was no prospect of a reconciliation.</i>

purvey	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc. <i>We didn't want to purvey gloom and doom.</i>
<u>restricted</u>	Restricted in meaning as e.g. man in a tall man. <i>Of restricted importance.</i>
<u>side</u>	Take sides for or against. <i>A side dish of fresh vegetables.</i>
<u>sole</u>	Put a new sole on. <i>Sole rights of publication.</i>
<u>transverse</u>	Extending or lying across; in a crosswise direction; at right angles to the long axis. <i>A transverse beam supports the dashboard.</i>
<u>unilateral</u>	(of an action or decision) performed by or affecting only one person, group, or country involved in a situation, without the agreement of another or the others. <i>A unilateral decision.</i>
uniquely	In a very special or unusual way. <i>Uniquely shaped buildings.</i>
unshared	Not shared with or by another or others. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>The end of the tunnel came into view.</i>
