<b>ambit</b>	An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control. <i>The <b>ambit</b> of municipal legislation.</i>
<a href="#">compass</a>	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it. <i>Crewe was ideally placed on the rail network with connections running to all points of the <b>compass</b>.</i>
<a href="#">horizon</a>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>The sun rose above the <b>horizon</b>.</i>
<a href="#">orbit</a>	One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He s out of my <b>orbit</b>.</i>

<b>outlook</b>	The prospect for the future. <i>He had a practical <b>outlook</b> on life.</i>
<b>perception</b>	Awareness of something through the senses. <i>He wouldn't have accepted said my mother with unusual <b>perception</b>.</i>
<b>perspective</b>	A view or prospect. <i>A trick of <b>perspective</b>.</i>
<b>range of experience</b>	The limit of capability.
<b>scope</b>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Infrared night <b>scopes</b>.</i>
<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Political reforms to match those in the economic <b>sphere</b>.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>They look the same in outward <b>view</b>.</i>

### Usage Examples of "Purview" as a noun

- *Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the purview of women generally.*
- *Such a case might be within the purview of the legislation.*

<b>across</b>	To the opposite side. <i>A crater some 30 metres <b>across</b>.</i>
<b>axis</b>	The central column of an inflorescence or other growth. <i>The Anglo American <b>axis</b>.</i>
<b>boundary</b>	A line which marks the limits of an area; a dividing line. <i>A <b>boundary</b> wall.</i>
<b>broaden</b>	Expand to encompass more people or things. <i>He has to <b>broaden</b> Labour's appeal to the whole community.</i>
<b>crossbar</b>	A horizontal bar that goes across something.
<b>edge</b>	Strike the ball with the edge of the bat strike a ball delivered by the bowler with the edge of the bat. <i>He rounded the <b>edges</b> of the box.</i>

<b><u>exclusive</u></b>	Catering for or available to only a few, select customers; high class and expensive. <i>Prices are <b>exclusive</b> of VAT.</i>
<b><u>facet</u></b>	A distinct feature or element in a problem. <i>A philosophy that extends to all <b>facets</b> of the business.</i>
<b>finite</b>	Limited in size or extent. <i>Every computer has a <b>finite</b> amount of memory.</i>
<b><u>horizon</u></b>	A great circle of the celestial sphere the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place. <i>The upper <b>horizon</b> of the site showed an arrangement of two rows of features.</i>
<b>horizontal</b>	A horizontal line plane etc. <i>A <b>horizontal</b> line.</i>
<b>incompleteness</b>	The state of being crude and incomplete and imperfect. <i>The study was criticized for <b>incompleteness</b> of data but it stimulated further research.</i>
<b>insofar</b>	To the degree or extent that. <i><b>Insofar</b> as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.</i>
<b>jag</b>	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>He clutched a <b>jag</b> of the rock.</i>
<b>localized</b>	Made local or oriented locally. <i>A decentralized and <b>localized</b> political authority.</i>
<b>longitudinal</b>	(of research or data) involving information about an individual or group gathered over a period of time. <i><b>Longitudinal</b> positions.</i>
<b><u>monopoly</u></b>	A board game in which players try to gain a monopoly on real estate as pieces advance around the board according to the throw of a die. <i>A <b>monopoly</b> on silver.</i>
<b><u>only</u></b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>Call me <b>only</b> if your cold gets worse.</i>
<b>orientation</b>	A person's awareness of self with regard to position and time and place and personal relationships. <i>Recent research in animal <b>orientation</b>.</i>
<b>prospect</b>	Chances or opportunities for success or wealth. <i>There was no <b>prospect</b> of a reconciliation.</i>

<b>purvey</b>	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc. <i>We didn't want to <b>purvey</b> gloom and doom.</i>
<b><u>restricted</u></b>	Restricted in meaning as e.g. man in a tall man. <i>Of <b>restricted</b> importance.</i>
<b><u>side</u></b>	Take sides for or against. <i>A <b>side</b> dish of fresh vegetables.</i>
<b><u>sole</u></b>	Put a new sole on. <i><b>Sole</b> rights of publication.</i>
<b><u>transverse</u></b>	Extending or lying across; in a crosswise direction; at right angles to the long axis. <i>A <b>transverse</b> beam supports the dashboard.</i>
<b><u>unilateral</u></b>	(of an action or decision) performed by or affecting only one person, group, or country involved in a situation, without the agreement of another or the others. <i>A <b>unilateral</b> decision.</i>
<b>uniquely</b>	In a very special or unusual way. <i><b>Uniquely</b> shaped buildings.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared with or by another or others. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>The end of the tunnel came into <b>view</b>.</i>
