<b><u>breeze</u></b>	A gentle wind. <i>Travelling through London was a <b>breeze</b>.</i>
<b>child's play</b>	Movement or space for movement.
<b>cinch</b>	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>He was a <b>cinch</b> to take a prize.</i>
<b>duck soup</b>	A heavy cotton fabric of plain weave; used for clothing and tents.
<b>five-finger exercise</b>	The act of using.
<b>gift</b>	A natural ability or talent. <i>He has a <b>gift</b> for comedy.</i>
<b>gravy train</b>	A procession (of wagons or mules or camels) traveling together in single file.
<b>man of straw</b>	The generic use of the word to refer to any human being.

<b>not a force to be reckoned with</b>	The influence that produces a change in a physical quantity.
<b>picnic</b>	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>We swam and went on <b>picnics</b>.</i>
<b>piece of cake</b>	A distance.
<b>sinecure</b>	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political <b>sinecures</b> for the supporters of ministers.</i>
<b>snap</b>	Tender green beans without strings that easily snap into sections. <i>The waistband had lost its <b>snap</b>.</i>
<b>unworthy opponent</b>	A contestant that you are matched against.
<b>walkover</b>	A victory awarded in a sports contest in the absence of the other competitor or competitors (as a result of injury, disqualification, etc). <i>A 12 2 <b>walkover</b>.</i>
<b>weakling</b>	A person who is physically weak and ineffectual. <i>He was a <b>weakling</b> and a hypocrite.</i>

### **beeline**

The most direct route.  
*He made a **beeline** for the bathroom.*

### **casual**

A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism.  
*A **casual** remark.*

### **clarity**

Free from obscurity and easy to understand; the comprehensibility of clear expression.  
*The **clarity** of the picture.*

<b>conciseness</b>	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<b>conveniently</b>	In a convenient manner. <i>This house is very <b>conveniently</b> located.</i>
<b>directness</b>	The quality of being plain and straightforward. <i>I like the simplicity and <b>directness</b> of the image.</i>
<b><u>ease</u></b>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>International tension began to <b>ease</b>.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i><b>Easy</b> money.</i>
<b>equitable</b>	Fair to all parties as dictated by reason and conscience. <i>The beneficiaries have an <b>equitable</b> interest in the property.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i><b>Fair</b> copy.</i>
<b><u>handy</u></b>	Skilful. <i>A <b>handy</b> gadget.</i>
<b><u>honest</u></b>	Gained or earned without cheating or stealing. <i>An <b>honest</b> working stiff.</i>
<b><u>insignificant</u></b>	Small and unimpressive. <i>A minor <b>insignificant</b> bureaucrat.</i>
<b><u>just</u></b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>It has <b>just</b> enough salt.</i>
<b><u>mere</u></b>	Being nothing more than specified. <i>The city is a <b>mere</b> 20 minutes from some stunning countryside.</i>
<b>purely</b>	In a pure manner. <i>Act nobly speak <b>purely</b> and think charitably.</i>
<b><u>readily</u></b>	In a punctual manner. <i>Transport is <b>readily</b> available.</i>
<b>realized</b>	Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>The joy of a <b>realized</b> ambition overcame him.</i>
<b><u>righteous</u></b>	Characterized by or proceeding from accepted standards of morality or justice. <i><b>Righteous</b> indignation.</i>
<b>rightful</b>	Having a legally established claim. <i>A <b>rightful</b> inheritance.</i>
<b>scarcely</b>	Almost not. <i>They could <b>scarcely</b> all be wrong.</i>

<b><u>shortcut</u></b>	An accelerated way of doing or achieving something. <i>Teaching no longer offered a <b>shortcut</b> to secure employment.</i>
<b>simple</b>	(botany) of leaf shapes; of leaves having no divisions or subdivisions. <i>A <b>simple</b> game.</i>
<b>simplicity</b>	A thing that is plain or uncomplicated. <i>They took advantage of her <b>simplicity</b>.</i>
<b><u>simply</u></b>	Merely; just. <i>They lived very <b>simply</b>.</i>
<b><u>straightforward</u></b>	Pointed directly ahead. <i>A <b>straightforward</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b><u>timely</u></b>	Done or occurring sufficiently early; prompt. <i>The <b>timely</b> filing of his income tax return.</i>
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>A <b>useful</b> pace bowler.</i>
<b>utilizable</b>	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<b>well</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Tears <b>well</b> in her eyes.</i>
