unworthy opponent	A contestant that you are matched against.
walkover	A victory awarded in a sports contest in the absence of the other competitor or competitors (as a result of injury, disqualification, etc. A 12 2 walkover .
weakling	A person who is physically weak and ineffectual. <i>He was a weakling and a hypocrite.</i>

purely	In a pure manner. Act nobly speak purely and think charitably.
<u>readily</u>	In a punctual manner. Transport is readily available.
realized	Successfully completed or brought to an end. The joy of a realized ambition overcame him.
<u>righteous</u>	Characterized by or proceeding from accepted standards of morality or justice. <i>Righteous</i> indignation.
rightful	Having a legally established claim. A rightful inheritance.
scarcely	Almost not. They could scarcely all be wrong.



<u>shortcut</u>	An accelerated way of doing or achieving something. <i>Teaching no longer offered a shortcut to secure employment.</i>
simple	(botany) of leaf shapes; of leaves having no divisions or subdivisions. A simple game.
simplicity	A thing that is plain or uncomplicated. They took advantage of her simplicity .
<u>simply</u>	Merely; just. They lived very simply .
<u>straightforward</u>	Pointed directly ahead. A straightforward set of instructions.
<u>timely</u>	Done or occurring sufficiently early; prompt. The timely filing of his income tax return.
useful	Having a useful function. A useful pace bowler.
utilizable	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
well	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Tears</i> well <i>in her eyes.</i>
