According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “pushover” as a noun can have the following definitions:

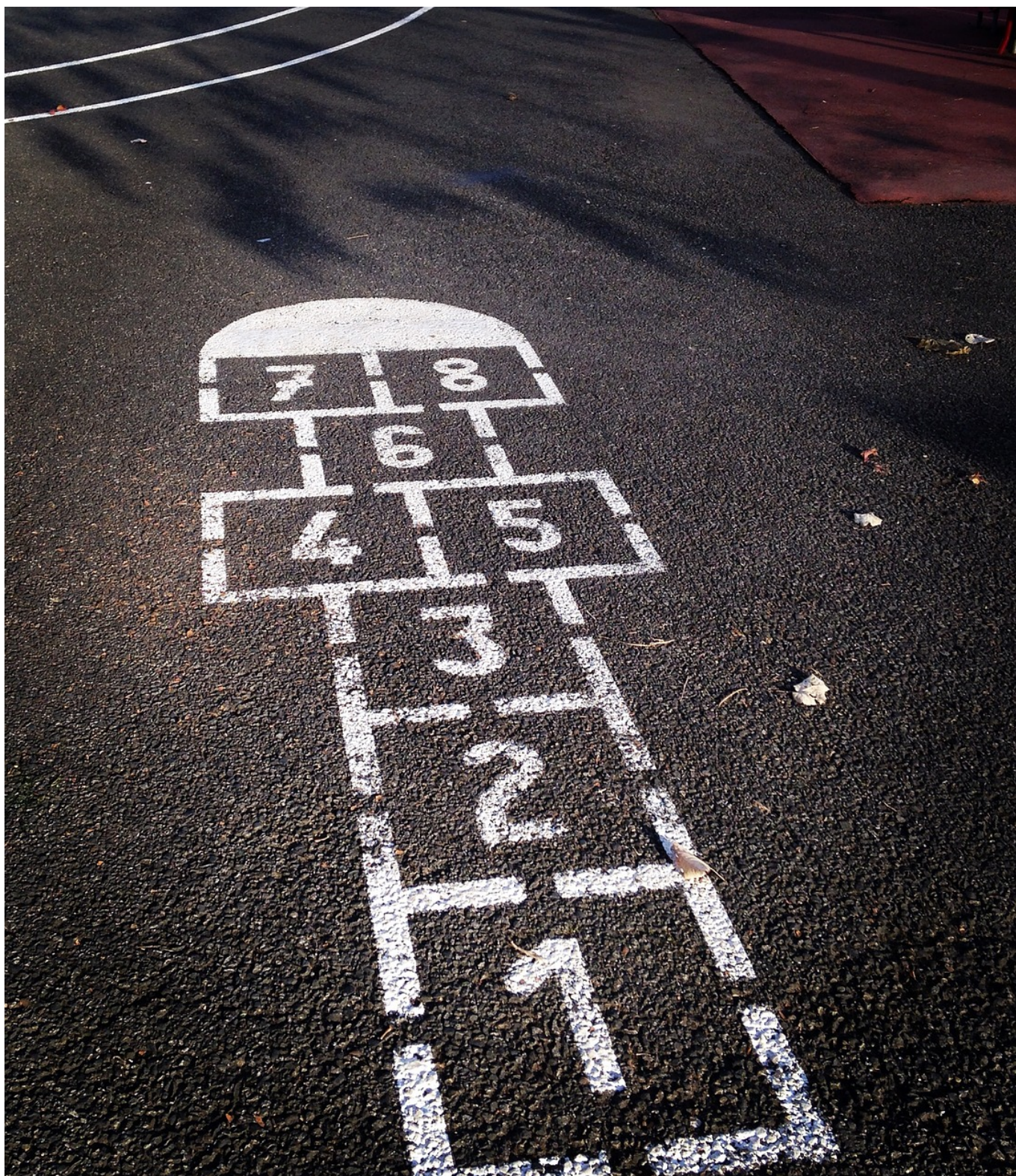
- *Any undertaking that is easy to do.*

<u>breeze</u>	A gentle wind. <i>Travelling through London was a breeze.</i>
child's play	Movement or space for movement.
cinch	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>He was a cinch to take a prize.</i>
duck soup	A heavy cotton fabric of plain weave; used for clothing and tents.
five-finger exercise	The act of using.
gift	A natural ability or talent. <i>He has a gift for comedy.</i>
gravy train	A procession (of wagons or mules or camels) traveling together in single file.
man of straw	The generic use of the word to refer to any human being.

not a force to be reckoned with	The influence that produces a change in a physical quantity.
picnic	Any undertaking that is easy to do. <i>We swam and went on picnics.</i>
piece of cake	A distance.
sinecure	A position requiring little or no work but giving the holder status or financial benefit. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
snap	Tender green beans without strings that easily snap into sections. <i>The waistband had lost its snap.</i>
unworthy opponent	A contestant that you are matched against.
walkover	A victory awarded in a sports contest in the absence of the other competitor or competitors (as a result of injury, disqualification, etc). <i>A 12 2 walkover.</i>
weakling	A person who is physically weak and ineffectual. <i>He was a weakling and a hypocrite.</i>

beeline

The most direct route.
*He made a **beeline** for the bathroom.*

casual

A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism.
*A **casual** remark.*

clarity

Free from obscurity and easy to understand; the comprehensibility of clear expression.
*The **clarity** of the picture.*

conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
conveniently	In a convenient manner. <i>This house is very conveniently located.</i>
directness	The quality of being plain and straightforward. <i>I like the simplicity and directness of the image.</i>
<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>International tension began to ease.</i>
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Easy money.</i>
equitable	Fair to all parties as dictated by reason and conscience. <i>The beneficiaries have an equitable interest in the property.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>Fair copy.</i>
<u>handy</u>	Skilful. <i>A handy gadget.</i>
<u>honest</u>	Gained or earned without cheating or stealing. <i>An honest working stiff.</i>
<u>insignificant</u>	Small and unimpressive. <i>A minor insignificant bureaucrat.</i>
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>It has just enough salt.</i>
<u>mere</u>	Being nothing more than specified. <i>The city is a mere 20 minutes from some stunning countryside.</i>
purely	In a pure manner. <i>Act nobly speak purely and think charitably.</i>
<u>readily</u>	In a punctual manner. <i>Transport is readily available.</i>
realized	Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>The joy of a realized ambition overcame him.</i>
<u>righteous</u>	Characterized by or proceeding from accepted standards of morality or justice. <i>Righteous indignation.</i>
rightful	Having a legally established claim. <i>A rightful inheritance.</i>
scarcely	Almost not. <i>They could scarcely all be wrong.</i>

<u>shortcut</u>	An accelerated way of doing or achieving something. <i>Teaching no longer offered a shortcut to secure employment.</i>
simple	(botany) of leaf shapes; of leaves having no divisions or subdivisions. <i>A simple game.</i>
simplicity	A thing that is plain or uncomplicated. <i>They took advantage of her simplicity.</i>
<u>simply</u>	Merely; just. <i>They lived very simply.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Pointed directly ahead. <i>A straightforward set of instructions.</i>
<u>timely</u>	Done or occurring sufficiently early; prompt. <i>The timely filing of his income tax return.</i>
useful	Having a useful function. <i>A useful pace bowler.</i>
utilizable	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
well	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Tears well in her eyes.</i>
