Definitions of "Puzzled" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “puzzled” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

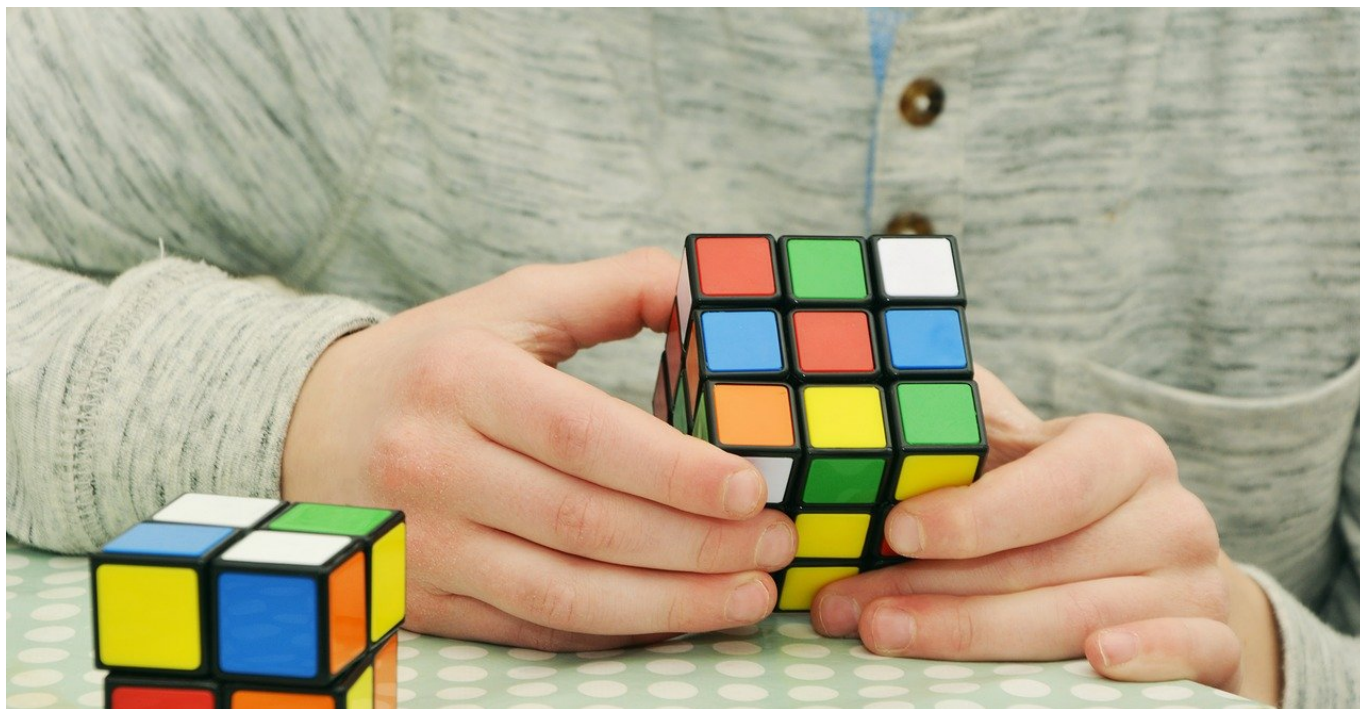
- *Filled with bewilderment.*
- *Unable to understand; perplexed.*



Synonyms of "Puzzled" as an adjective (2 Words)

nonplused Filled with bewilderment.

nonplussed So surprised and confused that one is unsure how to react.
*Henry looked completely **nonplussed**.*



Usage Examples of "Puzzled" as an adjective

- *Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.*
- *She looked puzzled and angry with him.*
- *The questioners were met with puzzled looks.*



Associations of "Puzzled" (30 Words)

<u>amaze</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
amazed	Greatly surprised; astonished. <i>Chandler looked absolutely amazed.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>It astonished her that he was so anxious.</i>
<u>astonished</u>	Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed. <i>He was astonished at the change in him.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Surprising greatly. <i>Such an enormous response was astonishing.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>

bemuse	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
<u>bewilder</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His reaction had bewildered her.</i>
<u>blank</u>	Cut a metal blank. <i>Blank tax return forms.</i>
<u>daze</u>	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>He was walking around in a daze.</i>
dumbfound	Greatly astonish or amaze. <i>I was dumbfounded by the low prices there.</i>
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.</i>
incredulity	The state of being unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i>She gave him a perplexed look.</i>
predicament	A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>Finds himself in a most awkward predicament.</i>
<u>quandary</u>	A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>A legal quandary.</i>
questioning	(of a look) suggesting that information is sought. <i>This situation should prompt questioning.</i>
quizzical	Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule). <i>She gave me a quizzical look.</i>
serendipity	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>
shock	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>Shocked onlookers watched as detectives broke into the pub.</i>
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>staggering</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
<u>stalemate</u>	Bring to or cause to reach stalemate. <i>Last time I played him it ended up in stalemate.</i>

stuck

Baffled.

*This problem has me completely **stuck**.*

stupefy

Make senseless or dizzy by or as if by a blow.

*The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to **stupefy** her.*

surprise

Cause to be surprised.

*Joe was **surprised** that he enjoyed the journey.*

surprised

Feeling or showing surprise.

*There was a **surprised** silence.*

wondering

Characterized by or expressive of a desire to know something; curious.

*Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a **wondering** look.*
