entanglement	The action or fact of entangling or being entangled. Many dolphins die from <b>entanglement</b> in fishing nets.
fen	100 fen equal 1 yuan in China. 55 acres of <b>fen</b> .
imbroglio	A confused heap. The abdication <b>imbroglio</b> of 1936.
jumble	Articles collected for a jumble sale. <i>The books were in a chaotic <b>jumble</b>.</i>
mare's nest	A kind of gun emplacement.
<u>marsh</u>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Marsh plants.</i>



marshland	Land consisting of marshes. Acres of meadows and <b>marshland</b> s.
mess	A meal eaten in a mess hall by service personnel. <i>Big time outfits that do a <b>mess</b> of printing.</i>
mire	A stretch of swampy or boggy ground. The country is still trying to climb out of the <b>mire</b> left by its previous president.
mix-up	A mistake that results from taking one thing to be another.
morass	A soft wet area of low-lying land that sinks underfoot. She would become lost in a <b>morass</b> of lies and explanations.
muddle	A confused multitude of things. She was able to cut through confusion and <b>muddle</b> .
peat bog	Partially carbonized vegetable matter saturated with water; can be used as a fuel when dried.
predicament	A difficult, unpleasant, or embarrassing situation. <i>The club s financial <b>predicament</b></i> .
quag	A soft wet area of low-lying land that sinks underfoot.
<u>quandary</u>	A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. A legal <b>quandary</b> .
quicksand	A treacherous situation that tends to entrap and destroy. John found himself sinking fast in financial <b>quicksand</b> .
slack	Casual trousers. He put on a grey shirt and loose cotton <b>slack</b> s.
slough	A hollow filled with mud. The economic <b>slough</b> of the interwar years.
<u>swamp</u>	Low land that is seasonally flooded; has more woody plants than a marsh and better drainage than a bog. The ceaseless deluge had turned the lawn into a <b>swamp</b> .
<u>tangle</u>	A twisted and tangled mass that is highly interwoven. The home team s defence got into an awful <b>tangle</b> .

# Associations of "Quagmire" (30 Words)

arroyo	A steep-sided gully formed by the action of fast-flowing water in an arid or semi-arid region, found chiefly in the south-western US.
<u>bog</u>	Get stuck while doing something. A peat <b>bog</b> .
<u>canyon</u>	A ravine formed by a river in an area with little rainfall. <i>The Grand Canyon</i> .
<u>clay</u>	A hardened clay surface for a tennis court. A <b>clay</b> tile.
cypress	Wood of any of various cypress trees especially of the genus Cupressus.
<u>damp</u>	Damp air or atmosphere. A <b>damp</b> ed suspension that isolates the chassis from external vibration.
dank	Unpleasantly cool and humid. A <b>dank</b> cellar.



delta	A code word representing the letter D, used in radio communication. <b>Delta</b> hepatitis.
<u>humid</u>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>A hot and <b>humid</b> day.</i>
impassable	Impossible to travel along or over. The narrow channels are <b>impassable</b> to ocean going ships.
jungle	An area of land overgrown with dense forest and tangled vegetation, typically in the tropics. <i>The lakes are hidden in dense jungle</i> .
mangrove	A tidal swamp which is dominated by mangroves.
<u>marsh</u>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Patches of marsh</i> .
marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Thousands of acres of marshland</i> .
marshy	(of soil) soft and watery. The <b>marshy</b> ground towards the sea.
mire	Soil with mud muck or mire. <i>Caught in the <b>mire</b> of poverty.</i>
morass	An area of muddy or boggy ground. She would become lost in a <b>morass</b> of lies and explanations.
<u>mud</u>	Plaster with mud. <i>Mud</i> huts.
muddy	Cause to become muddy. <i>Muddy coffee.</i>
mudslide	A landslide of mud.
quicksand	A treacherous situation that tends to entrap and destroy. John found himself sinking fast in financial <b>quicksand</b> .
riparian	Relating to wetlands adjacent to rivers and streams. The ranch s most expansive <b>riparian</b> habitat.
slough	A stagnant swamp (especially as part of a bayou. The economic <b>slough</b> of the interwar years.
sludge	An unattractive muddy shade of brown or green. <i>The dumping of sewage <b>sludge</b></i> .
soggy	Dull and lifeless. We squelched through the <b>soggy</b> ground.



splashing	The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.
<u>swamp</u>	Overwhelm or flood with water. The country was <b>swamp</b> ed with goods from abroad.
swampy	Characteristic of or resembling a swamp. A <b>swampy</b> area.
<u>wet</u>	Wetness caused by water. A <b>wet</b> cow.
wetland	Land consisting of marshes or swamps; saturated land. The draining of British <b>wetland</b> s.
