A basic interval in classical Western music equal to two semitones and separating for example the first and second notes of an ordinary scale such as C and D or E and F sharp a major second.
*A clergyman improved the **tone** of the meeting.*

oaken	Consisting of or made of wood of the oak tree. <i>The old oaken bucket.</i>
oddy	A strange attitude or habit. <i>She was regarded as a bit of an oddy.</i>
peculiarity	The quality of being peculiar. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British peculiarity.</i>
pistol	Shoot someone with a pistol. <i>When we first met he was a pistol full of ideals and a natural leader.</i>
revolver	A pistol with revolving chambers enabling several shots to be fired without reloading.

workmanlike	Showing efficient competence but not inspiration. <i>A steady workmanlike approach.</i>
workmanship	The degree of skill with which a product is made or a job done. <i>Cracks on the motorway were caused by poor workmanship.</i>
