Make (someone) feel isolated or estranged. The boring work alienate d his employees.
The state or experience of being alienated. Most leases contain restrictions against alienation .
Used to emphasize that only one factor out of several is being considered and that the whole is greater or more extreme. <i>The burden of proof rests on the prosecution alone</i> .
Showing smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements. <i>He had become</i> complacent <i>after years of success.</i>
Cord or ribbon worn as an insignia of honor or rank. The city centre was cordon ed off after fires were discovered in two stores.
Avoiding emotional involvement. <i>Structural problems resulted in cracking and detachment of the wall.</i>
(especially in abstract contexts) disconnect or separate. These compounds are dissociate d by solar radiation to yield atoms of chlorine.
Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>He was MP for the Lancaster division of North Lancashire.</i>
Get a divorce formally terminate a marriage. A desire to divorce myself from history.
Remove from customary environment or associations. <i>He became</i> estrange <i>d</i> from his father.
Hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of the foreign state in which the crime was committed. <i>They</i> extradite <i>d</i> the fugitive to his native country so he could be tried <i>there.</i>



facility	A building or place that provides a particular service or is used for a particular industry. An overdraft facility .
hospice	A lodging for travellers, especially one run by a religious order. <i>Hospice</i> workers.
insular	Ignorant of or uninterested in cultures, ideas, or peoples outside one's own experience. <i>Insular</i> attitudes toward foreigners.
isolate	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. A country which is isolate d from the rest of the world.
isolated	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others- Sherwood Anderson. Little isolated worlds as abruptly disjunct and unexpected as a palm shaded well in the Sahara.
<u>isolation</u>	A country's withdrawal from international politics. Isolation from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.
partition	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. The cafe was divided up by glass partition s.
<u>remote</u>	A remote control device. A remote possibility.
schism	The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. The widening schism between Church leaders and politicians.
seclude	Keep (someone) away from other people. I seclude d myself up here for a life of study and meditation.
secluded	Hidden from general view or use. A secluded romantic spot.
seclusion	The state of being private and away from other people. They enjoyed ten days of peace and seclusion .
<u>segregate</u>	Someone who is or has been segregated. <i>We don t segregate in this county.</i>
segregation	(genetics) the separation of paired alleles during meiosis so that members of each pair of alleles appear in different gametes. <i>The segregation of pupils with learning difficulties.</i>
separate	A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>The couple separated after 25 years of marriage.</i>



<u>separation</u>	(law) the cessation of cohabitation of man and wife (either by mutual agreement or under a court order. <i>Religion involved the separation of the sacred and the profane.</i>
<u>sequester</u>	Keep away from others. <i>The cations were sequestered.</i>

underpopulated Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.
