| alienate | Make (someone) feel isolated or estranged. <i>The boring work alienated his employees.</i> |
| alienation | The state or experience of being alienated. <i>Most leases contain restrictions against alienation.</i> |
| alone | Used to emphasize that only one factor out of several is being considered and that the whole is greater or more extreme. <i>The burden of proof rests on the prosecution alone.</i> |
| complacent | Showing smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements. <i>He had become complacent after years of success.</i> |
| cordon | Cord or ribbon worn as an insignia of honor or rank. <i>The city centre was cordoned off after fires were discovered in two stores.</i> |
| detachment | Avoiding emotional involvement. <i>Structural problems resulted in cracking and detachment of the wall.</i> (especially in abstract contexts) disconnect or separate. |
| dissociate | <i>These compounds are dissociated by solar radiation to yield atoms of chlorine.</i> |
| division | Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>He was MP for the Lancaster division of North Lancashire.</i> |
| divorce | Get a divorce formally terminate a marriage. <i>A desire to divorce myself from history.</i> |
| estrangle | Remove from customary environment or associations. <i>He became estranged from his father.</i> |
| extradite | Hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of the foreign state in which the crime was committed. <i>They extradited the fugitive to his native country so he could be tried there.</i> |

| facility | A building or place that provides a particular service or is used for a particular industry. <i>An overdraft facility.</i> |
| hospice | A lodging for travellers, especially one run by a religious order. <i>Hospice workers.</i> |
| insular | Ignorant of or uninterested in cultures, ideas, or peoples outside one's own experience. <i>Insular attitudes toward foreigners.</i> |
| isolate | A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>A country which is isolated from the rest of the world.</i> |
| isolated | Being or feeling set or kept apart from others- Sherwood Anderson. <i>Little isolated worlds as abruptly disjunct and unexpected as a palm shaded well in the Sahara.</i> |
| isolation | A country's withdrawal from international politics. <i>Isolation from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i> |
| partition | Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i>The cafe was divided up by glass partitions.</i> |
| remote | A remote control device. <i>A remote possibility.</i> |
| schism | The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. <i>The widening schism between Church leaders and politicians.</i> |
| seclude | Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I secluded myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i> |
| secluded | Hidden from general view or use. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i> |
| seclusion | The state of being private and away from other people. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and seclusion.</i> |
| segregate | Someone who is or has been segregated. <i>We don't segregate in this county.</i> |
| segregation | (genetics) the separation of paired alleles during meiosis so that members of each pair of alleles appear in different gametes. <i>The segregation of pupils with learning difficulties.</i> |
| separate | A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>The couple separated after 25 years of marriage.</i> |

separation (law) the cessation of cohabitation of man and wife (either by mutual agreement or under a court order.
*Religion involved the **separation** of the sacred and the profane.*

sequester Keep away from others.
*The cations were **sequestered**.*

underpopulated Having a lower population density than normal or desirable.
*The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.*
