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## Associations of "Quarantine s" (30 Words)

<a href="#">alienate</a>	Make (someone) feel isolated or estranged. <i>The boring work <b>alienated</b> his employees.</i>
<a href="#">alienation</a>	The state or experience of being alienated. <i>Most leases contain restrictions against <b>alienation</b>.</i>
<b>alone</b>	Used to emphasize that only one factor out of several is being considered and that the whole is greater or more extreme. <i>The burden of proof rests on the prosecution <b>alone</b>.</i>
<a href="#">complacent</a>	Showing smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements. <i>He had become <b>complacent</b> after years of success.</i>
<b>cordon</b>	Cord or ribbon worn as an insignia of honor or rank. <i>The city centre was <b>cordoned</b> off after fires were discovered in two stores.</i>
<b>detachment</b>	Avoiding emotional involvement. <i>Structural problems resulted in cracking and <b>detachment</b> of the wall.</i> (especially in abstract contexts) disconnect or separate.
<a href="#">dissociate</a>	<i>These compounds are <b>dissociated</b> by solar radiation to yield atoms of chlorine.</i>
<b>division</b>	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>He was MP for the Lancaster <b>division</b> of North Lancashire.</i>
<a href="#">divorce</a>	Get a divorce formally terminate a marriage. <i>A desire to <b>divorce</b> myself from history.</i>
<b>estrangle</b>	Remove from customary environment or associations. <i>He became <b>estranged</b> from his father.</i>
<b>extradite</b>	Hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of the foreign state in which the crime was committed. <i>They <b>extradited</b> the fugitive to his native country so he could be tried there.</i>

<b>facility</b>	A building or place that provides a particular service or is used for a particular industry. <i>An overdraft <b>facility</b>.</i>
<b>hospice</b>	A lodging for travellers, especially one run by a religious order. <i><b>Hospice</b> workers.</i>
<b>insular</b>	Ignorant of or uninterested in cultures, ideas, or peoples outside one's own experience. <i><b>Insular</b> attitudes toward foreigners.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>A country which is <b>isolated</b> from the rest of the world.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others- Sherwood Anderson. <i>Little <b>isolated</b> worlds as abruptly disjunct and unexpected as a palm shaded well in the Sahara.</i>
<b>isolation</b>	A country's withdrawal from international politics. <i><b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
<b>partition</b>	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i>The cafe was divided up by glass <b>partitions</b>.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i>A <b>remote</b> possibility.</i>
<b>schism</b>	The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. <i>The widening <b>schism</b> between Church leaders and politicians.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	Hidden from general view or use. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The state of being private and away from other people. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b>segregate</b>	Someone who is or has been segregated. <i>We don't <b>segregate</b> in this county.</i>
<b>segregation</b>	(genetics) the separation of paired alleles during meiosis so that members of each pair of alleles appear in different gametes. <i>The <b>segregation</b> of pupils with learning difficulties.</i>
<b>separate</b>	A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>The couple <b>separated</b> after 25 years of marriage.</i>

**separation** (law) the cessation of cohabitation of man and wife (either by mutual agreement or under a court order.  
*Religion involved the **separation** of the sacred and the profane.*

**sequester** Keep away from others.  
*The cations were **sequestered**.*

**underpopulated** Having a lower population density than normal or desirable.  
*The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.*
