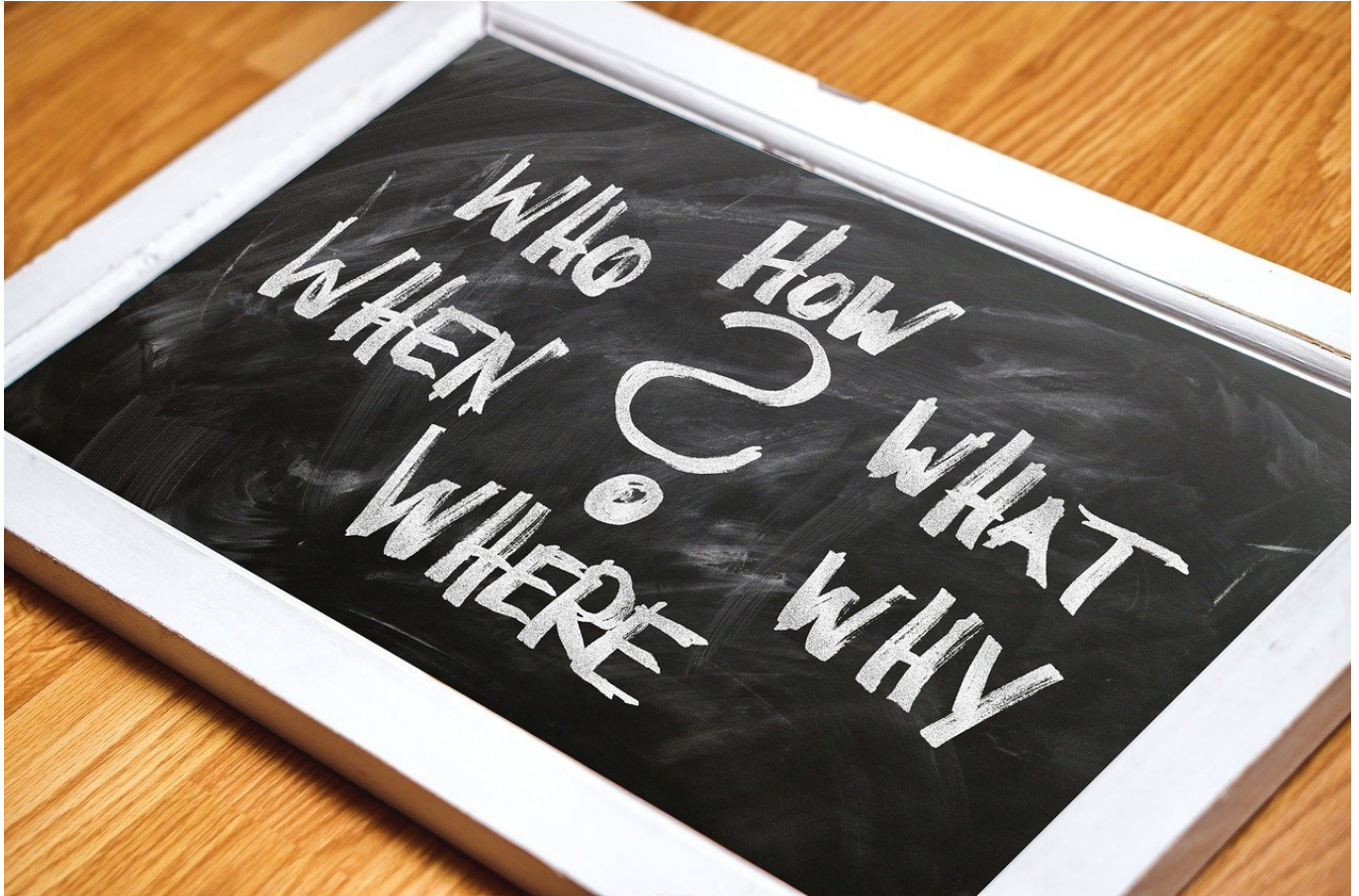

## Questionable as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Questionable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “questionable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Doubtful as regards truth or validity.*
- *Able to be refuted.*
- *Subject to question.*
- *Likely to be dishonourable or morally suspect.*



## Synonyms of "Questionable" as an adjective (31 Words)

<b>arguable</b>	Able to be argued or asserted. <i>It was <b>arguable</b> that the bank had no authority to honour the cheques.</i>
<b>confutable</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b>confutative</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b><u>contentious</u></b>	Causing or likely to cause an argument; controversial. <i>The socio economic plan had been the subject of <b>contentious</b> debate.</i>
<b><u>controversial</u></b>	Marked by or capable of arousing controversy. <i>Rushdie s <b>controversial</b> book.</i>
<b>dark</b>	Used of color having a dark hue. <i>A <b>dark</b> vision of the future.</i>
<b><u>debatable</u></b>	Open to doubt or debate. <i>It is <b>debatable</b> whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>

<b>disreputable</b>	Lacking respectability in character or behavior or appearance. <i>He was heavy grubby and vaguely <b>disreputable</b>.</i>
<b>doubtful</b>	Not established as genuine or acceptable. <i>I was <b>doubtful</b> of my judgement.</i>
<b>dubious</b>	Morally suspect. <i>What one found uncertain the other found <b>dubious</b> or downright false.</i>
<b>in dispute</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in doubt</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in question</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>irregular</b>	; not level or flat or symmetrical. <i>His strong <b>irregular</b> features.</i>
<b>murky</b>	Obscure or morally questionable. <i>The <b>murky</b> silt of a muddy pond.</i>
<b>mysterious</b>	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. <i>She was <b>mysterious</b> about herself but said plenty about her husband.</i>
<b>odd</b>	Not easily explained. <i>They lost a close fought game by the <b>odd</b> goal in five.</i>
<b>open to doubt</b>	Possibly accepting or permitting.
<b>open to question</b>	Without undue constriction as from e.g. tenseness or inhibition.
<b>problematic</b>	Constituting or presenting a problem. <i>If you ever get married which seems to be extremely <b>problematic</b>.</i>
<b>problematical</b>	Open to doubt or debate. <i>A highly <b>problematical</b> relationship.</i>
<b>refutable</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b>shifty</b>	Changing position or direction. <i><b>Shifty</b> winds.</i>
<b>strange</b>	Unaccustomed to or unfamiliar with. <i>A <b>strange</b> fantastical mind.</i>
<b>suspect</b>	Not as expected. <i>A <b>suspect</b> package was found on the platform.</i>
<b>suspicious</b>	Not as expected. <i><b>Suspicious</b> behavior.</i>
<b>uncertain</b>	Not able to be relied on; not known or definite. <i>The issue is <b>uncertain</b>.</i>
<b>under suspicion</b>	Located below or beneath something else.

**unsavoury** Not pleasing in odor or taste.  
*They looked at the scanty **unsavoury** portions of food doled out to them.*

**unsure** (of a fact) not fixed or certain.  
*She was feeling nervous **unsure** of herself.*



## Usage Examples of "Questionable" as an adjective

- *It is questionable whether any of these exceptions is genuine.*
- *A fire of questionable origin.*
- *His questionable financial deals.*
- *A questionable reputation.*
- *Questionable motives.*



## Associations of "Questionable" (30 Words)

- alleged** Doubtful or suspect.  
*The **alleged** conspirators.*
- apocryphal** (of a story or statement) of doubtful authenticity, although widely circulated as being true.  
*An **apocryphal** story about a former president.*
- askance** Directed to one side with or as if with doubt or suspicion or envy-Elizabeth Bowen.  
*The reformers looked **askance** at the mystical tradition.*
- askew** Turned or twisted toward one side.  
*The plan went sadly **askew**.*
- contention** A point asserted as part of an argument.  
*The teams were in fierce **contention** for first place.*
- contentiousness** An inclination to be quarrelsome and contentious.
- controversial** Giving rise or likely to give rise to controversy or public disagreement.  
*The issue of the death penalty is highly **controversial**.*

<b><u>controversy</u></b>	Prolonged public disagreement or heated discussion. <i>The design of the building has caused <b>controversy</b>.</i>
<b><u>debatable</u></b>	Capable of being disproved. <i>It is <b>debatable</b> whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
<b>discussion</b>	The action or process of talking about something in order to reach a decision or to exchange ideas. <i>The EC directive is currently under <b>discussion</b>.</i>
<b>disproof</b>	The act of determining that something is false. <i>Rex was living <b>disproof</b> of the youth preserving powers imputed to life in the college.</i>
<b>disputable</b>	Capable of being disproved. <i>Whether it can be described as art criticism may be <b>disputable</b>.</i>
<b>disputatious</b>	Fond of having heated arguments. <i>It s a congenial hang out for <b>disputatious</b> academics.</i>
<b>doubtful</b>	Improbable. <i>The fire was of <b>doubtful</b> origin.</i>
<b><u>dubious</u></b>	Of questionable value. <i>He has a <b>dubious</b> record indeed.</i>
<b>hassel</b>	Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules (1897-1981).
<b><u>incredulous</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>An <b>incredulous</b> gasp.</i>
<b><u>irresponsible</u></b>	Showing lack of care for consequences. <i>It would have been <b>irresponsible</b> just to drive on.</i>
<b><u>leery</u></b>	Cautious or wary due to realistic suspicions. <i>A city <b>leery</b> of gang violence.</i>
<b>polemical</b>	Of or involving dispute or controversy. <i>A <b>polemical</b> essay.</i>
<b>problematic</b>	Constituting or presenting a problem. <i>If you ever get married which seems to be extremely <b>problematic</b>.</i>
<b>refutable</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b>sceptical</b>	Not easily convinced; having doubts or reservations. <i>The public were deeply <b>sceptical</b> about some of the proposals.</i>
<b><u>shady</u></b>	Giving shade from sunlight. <i>He was involved in his grandmother s <b>shady</b> deals.</i>
<b>sidelong</b>	Inclining or directed to one side. <i>He looked <b>sidelong</b> at her with a quick smile.</i>

**skeptical**

Denying or questioning the tenets of especially a religion.  
*A **skeptical** attitude.*

**supposed**

Doubtful or suspect.  
*The **supposed** existence of ghosts.*

**suspicious**

Having or showing a cautious distrust of someone or something.  
*She gave him a **suspicious** look.*

**suspiciously**

With a cautious distrust or suspicion of someone or something.  
*What s going on I asked **suspiciously**.*

**unconfirmed**

Not finally established or settled.  
*An **unconfirmed** letter of credit.*
