
Questionable as an Adjective

- Doubtful as regards truth or validity.
- Able to be refuted.
- Subject to question.
- Likely to be dishonourable or morally suspect.





Synonyms of "Questionable" as an adjective (31 Words)

arguable Able to be argued or asserted.

contentious Causing or likely to cause an argument; controversial.

The socio economic plan had been the subject of **contentious** debate.

controversial Marked by or capable of arousing controversy.

Rushdie s **controversial** book.

dark Used of color having a dark hue.

A **dark** vision of the future.

debatable Open to doubt or debate.

It is **debatable** whether the country is coming out of recession.



disreputable Lacking respectability in character or behavior or appearance.

He was heavy grubby and vaguely **disreputable**.

doubtful Not established as genuine or acceptable.

I was **doubtful** of my judgement.

dubious Morally suspect.

What one found uncertain the other found **dubious** or downright false.

in dispute Directed or bound inward.
in doubt Currently fashionable.

Directed or bound inward.

in question Directed or bound inward.

irregular; not level or flat or symmetrical.

His strong irregular features.

murky Obscure or morally questionable.

The murky silt of a muddy pond.

Of an obscure nature- Rachel.

mysterious

She was mysterious about herself but said plenty about her husband.

odd Not easily explained.

They lost a close fought game by the **odd** goal in five.

open to doubt Possibly accepting or permitting.

open to question Without undue constriction as from e.g. tenseness or inhibition.

problematic Constituting or presenting a problem.

If you ever get married which seems to be extremely **problematic**.

problematical Open to doubt or debate.

A highly **problematical** relationship.

refutable Able to be refuted.

shifty Changing position or direction.

Shifty winds.

strange Unaccustomed to or unfamiliar with.

A **strange** fantastical mind.

Not as expected.

Suspect

A suspect package was found on the platform.

SuspiciousNot as expected. **Suspicious** behavior.

Not able to be relied on; not known or definite.

uncertain

The issue is uncertain.

under suspicion Located below or beneath something else.



Not pleasing in odor or taste.

unsavoury They looked at the scanty **unsavoury** portions of food doled out to

them.

(of a fact) not fixed or certain.

She was feeling nervous **unsure** of herself.

doubtful Improbable.

The fire was of **doubtful** origin.

dubious Of questionable value.

He has a **dubious** record indeed.

irresponsible Showing lack of care for consequences.

polemical Of or involving dispute or controversy.

A **polemical** essay.

problematic Constituting or presenting a problem.

If you ever get married which seems to be extremely **problematic**.

refutable Able to be refuted.

sceptical Not easily convinced; having doubts or reservations.

The public were deeply **sceptical** about some of the proposals.

Giving shade from sunlight.

sidelong Inclining or directed to one side.

He looked **sidelong** at her with a quick smile.



Denying or questioning the tenets of especially a religion. **skeptical**
