**exam**

A set of questions or exercises evaluating skill or knowledge.  
*He was likely to fail his **exams** again.*

**examination**

The action or process of conducting an examination.  
*He scraped through the **examinations** at the end of his first year.*

**form**

A set order of words a formula.  
*They both had **form**.*

**opinion poll**

A vague idea in which some confidence is placed.

**question sheet**

Uncertainty about the truth or factuality or existence of something.

**quiz**

A test of knowledge, especially as a competition between individuals or teams as a form of entertainment.  
*A pub **quiz**.*

- set of questions** The act of putting something in position.
- survey form** The act of looking or seeing or observing.
- test** The act of undergoing testing.  
*When the **test** was stolen the professor had to make a new set of questions.*

- albedo** The proportion of the incident light or radiation that is reflected by a surface, typically that of a planet or moon.  
*The lunar maria have a lower **albedo** than the surrounding terrain.*
- answer** Give the correct answer or solution to.  
***Answer** a question.*
- answering** Replying.  
*An **answering** glance.*
- appellant** The party who appeals a decision of a lower court.

| <b>poll</b>           | Convert into a pollard.<br><i>There were some beautiful willows and now the idiot Parson has <b>polled</b> them into wretched stumps.</i>  |
| <b>pollster</b>       | A person who conducts or analyses opinion polls.<br><i>A <b>pollster</b> conducts public opinion polls.</i>  |
| <b>query</b>          | Ask a question about something, especially in order to express one's doubts about it or to check its validity or accuracy.<br><i>I rang the water company to <b>query</b> my bill.</i> |
| <b>react</b>          | Show a response or a reaction to something.<br><i>The hydrogen and the oxygen <b>react</b>.</i>  |
| <b>reactive</b>       | Showing a response to a stimulus.<br><i>A proactive rather than a <b>reactive</b> approach.</i>  |
| <b>reconnaissance</b> | The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy).<br><i>Conducting client <b>reconnaissance</b>.</i>  |
| <b>reconnoiter</b>    | Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.   |
| <b>reexamine</b>      | Look at again; examine again.  |
| <b>rejoinder</b>      | A defendant's answer to the plaintiff's reply or replication.<br><i>It brought a sharp <b>rejoinder</b> from the teacher.</i>  |

| <b>respondent</b> | The codefendant especially in a divorce proceeding who is accused of adultery with the correspondent.<br><i>The <b>respondent</b> defendant.</i>                                       |
| <b>responsive</b> | Responding readily and with interest.<br><i>A flexible service that is <b>responsive</b> to changing social patterns.</i>  |
| <b>review</b>     | Hold a review of troops.<br><i>All areas of the company will come under <b>review</b>.</i>   |
| <b>riposte</b>    | A quick, clever reply to an insult or criticism.<br><i>You ve got a strange sense of honour Grant <b>riposted</b>.</i>   |
| <b>statistic</b>  | A datum that can be represented numerically.<br><i>The <b>statistics</b> show that the crime rate has increased.</i>   |
| <b>survey</b>     | Make a survey of for statistical purposes.<br><i>I <b>surveyed</b> the options.</i>  |
