<b>adeptness</b>	The quality of being able to meet a need satisfactorily. <i>His quick <b>adeptness</b> was a product of good design.</i>
<b>adroitness</b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty. <i>He lacks political <b>adroitness</b>.</i>
<b>celerity</b>	A rate that is rapid.
<b>deftness</b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty.
<b>facility</b>	A natural effortlessness-Jane Austen. <i>A manufacturing <b>facility</b>.</i>
<b>quick-wittedness</b>	Intelligence as revealed by an ability to give correct responses without delay.
<b>rapidity</b>	The fact of happening at a great rate; swiftness. <i>The fish sank into the sand with such <b>rapidity</b> that it must be seen to be believed.</i>
<b>rapidness</b>	A rate that is rapid.
<b>speediness</b>	A rate that is rapid.

<b>acceleration</b>	A vehicle's capacity to gain speed. <i>The three litre model has spectacular <b>acceleration</b>.</i>
<b><u>adaptability</u></b>	The capacity to be modified for a new use or purpose. <i><b>Adaptability</b> is an advantage in the harshly competitive global economy.</i>
<b>adroitness</b>	Cleverness or skill. <i>He lacks political <b>adroitness</b>.</i>
<b><u>agility</u></b>	Ability to move quickly and easily. <i>Though he was without formal training as dancer or athlete his physical <b>agility</b> was inexhaustible.</i>
<b>airspeed</b>	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
<b>celerity</b>	Swiftness of movement.
<b>conduction</b>	The conveying of fluid through a channel.
<b>deftness</b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty.
<b>fast</b>	Firmly or closely. <i>A <b>fast</b> car.</i>
<b>fastness</b>	A rate (usually rapid) at which something happens. <i>The dyes differ in their <b>fastness</b> to light.</i>
<b><u>haste</u></b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>I write in <b>haste</b>.</i>
<b>hasten</b>	Act or move at high speed. <i>This tragedy probably <b>hastened</b> his own death from heart disease.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>We d better <b>hurry</b>.</i>
<b><u>lightness</u></b>	The visual effect of illumination on objects or scenes as created in pictures. <i>The <b>lightness</b> of her silky hair.</i>
<b>measurement</b>	A unit or system of measuring. <i>A hand is a <b>measurement</b> used for measuring horses.</i>
<b>pace</b>	Go at a pace. <i>Kirov stepped back a <b>pace</b>.</i>
<b>promptitude</b>	The quality of acting quickly and without delay. <i>He arranges everything with extraordinary <b>promptitude</b> and foresight.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Make or become faster or quicker. <i>Her interest <b>quicken</b>ed.</i>

<b>race</b>	Compete in a race. <i>The <b>race</b> for the presidency.</i>
<b>rapidity</b>	The quality of moving or reacting with great speed. <i>The fish sank into the sand with such <b>rapidity</b> that it must be seen to be believed.</i>
<b>reflex</b>	In reflexology a response in a part of the body to stimulation of a corresponding point on the feet hands or head. <i>A newborn baby is equipped with basic <b>reflexes</b>.</i>
<b>responsiveness</b>	The quality of being responsive; reacting quickly; as a quality of people, it involves responding with emotion to people and events. <i>A bank s <b>responsiveness</b> to customer problems engenders trust.</i>
<b>speed</b>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>The course is delivered online so students can progress at their own <b>speed</b>.</i>
<b>speedometer</b>	An instrument on a vehicle's dashboard indicating its speed.
<b>speedy</b>	Done or occurring quickly. <i>A <b>speedy</b> recovery.</i>
<b>stronghold</b>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A Labour <b>stronghold</b>.</i>
<b>suppleness</b>	Adaptability of mind or character. <i>He increased the leanness and <b>suppleness</b> of the organization.</i>
<b>swift</b>	Swiftly. <i><b>Swift</b> flight of an arrow.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	The quality of moving at high speed. <i>The dynasty crumbled with alarming <b>swiftness</b>.</i>
<b>velocity</b>	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible <b>velocity</b>.</i>
