favorite	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>That book is one of my favorites.</i>
good	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>The meat is still good.</i>
indulging	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.

like	Want to have. <i>I responded in like manner.</i>
moll	A prostitute. <i>I'd rush the money over to his moll.</i>
perquisite	A thing which has served its primary use and to which a subordinate or employee has a customary right. <i>The perquisites of celebrity are intoxicating.</i>
plus	On the positive side or higher end of a scale. <i>A plus value.</i>
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>The company received a positive response from investors.</i>
predilection	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>A predilection for expensive cars.</i>
preeminence	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
prefer	Give preference to one creditor over another. <i>Some people prefer camping to staying in hotels.</i>
prerogative	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. <i>The monarch retained the formal prerogative power to appoint the Prime Minister.</i>
privilege	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>A breach of parliamentary privilege.</i>
profiteer	A person who profiteers. <i>They claim he has illegally profiteered from his businesses in a number of ways.</i>
sideways	With one side forward or to the front. <i>He hurried towards his office without a sideways glance.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. <i>The Bey of Tunis was building himself a superb mausoleum.</i>
tout	Show off. <i>This product was touted as a revolutionary invention.</i>
unmatched	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>He has a talent unmatched by any other politician.</i>
upside	The more positive aspect of a situation. <i>Being self-employed has its upside.</i>
