Synonyms of "Quirky" as an adjective (20 Words)

alternative	(of two things) mutually exclusive. <i>Alternative possibilities were neutrality or war.</i>
bizarre	Very strange or unusual. <i>His behaviour became more and more bizarre.</i>
<u>bohemian</u>	Socially unconventional in an artistic way. <i>As an opera singer you live a bohemian lifestyle.</i>
<u>eccentric</u>	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>He noted her eccentric appearance.</i>
far-out	Informal terms; strikingly unconventional.
freakish	Very unusual, strange, or unexpected. <i>A freakish extra toe.</i>
<u>idiosyncratic</u>	Relating to idiosyncrasy; peculiar or individual. <i>Michelangelo's highly idiosyncratic style of painting.</i>

odd	(of whole numbers such as 3 and 5) having one left over as a remainder when divided by two. <i>Invited 30 odd guests.</i>
offbeat	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>A rapid tempo is essential here otherwise we will not sense the offbeat hemiolas.</i>
out of the ordinary	Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.
outlandish	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>Three wise outlandish kings.</i>
peculiar	Particular; special. <i>A peculiar bond of sympathy between them.</i>
strange	Denoting or involving a flavour (variety) of unstable quark having an electric charge of -1/3. Strange quarks have similar properties to down quarks and bottom quarks, but are distinguished from them by having an intermediate mass. <i>It is strange how things change.</i>
unconventional	Not conforming to legality, moral law, or social convention. <i>An unconventional marriage.</i>
unorthodox	Breaking with convention or tradition. <i>An unorthodox lifestyle.</i>
unusual	Not commonly encountered. <i>A scene of unusual beauty.</i>
way-out	Informal terms; strikingly unconventional.
weird	Suggesting something supernatural; unearthly. <i>Some trick of the moonlight some weird effect of shadow.</i>
zany	Ludicrous, foolish. <i>His zany humour.</i>



Usage Examples of "Quirky" as an adjective

- *Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky.*



Associations of "Quirky" (30 Words)

amusing	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>An amusing speaker.</i>
bespectacled	Wearing glasses. <i>A bespectacled grandmother.</i>
comical	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. <i>A series of comical misunderstandings.</i>
droll	Curious or unusual in a way that provokes dry amusement. <i>His unique brand of droll self mockery.</i>
<u>eccentric</u>	A person of a specified kind usually with many eccentricities. <i>He s seen as a local eccentric.</i>
fun	A source of fun. <i>They are just funning you.</i>

funny	Comic strips in newspapers. <i>That s funny that vase of flowers has been moved.</i>
geek	A performer at a carnival or circus whose show consists of bizarre or grotesque acts. <i>I am totally geeking out over this upcoming film.</i>
goofy	Foolish or harmlessly eccentric. <i>A goofy grin.</i>
hilarious	Extremely amusing. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The humors are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>His humorous grey eyes.</i>
jocose	Playful or humorous. <i>A jocose allusion.</i>
jocular	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject jocularly.</i>
joke	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>He told a very funny joke.</i>
laugh	The sound of laughing. <i>That s a laugh the idea of you cooking a meal.</i>
laughable	So ludicrous as to be amusing. <i>A contribution so small as to be laughable.</i>
ludicrous	Incongruous;inviting ridicule. <i>It is ludicrous to call a cottage a mansion.</i>
mischievous	(of an action or statement) causing or intended to cause harm or trouble. <i>A mischievous grin.</i>
offbeat	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>The horns come in full force on the offbeats.</i>
playful	Intended for one's own or others' amusement rather than seriously. <i>The ballet accents the playful use of movement.</i>
pleasure	Sensual gratification. <i>He serves at the pleasure of the President.</i>
puckish	Naughtily or annoyingly playful. <i>A puckish sense of humour.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>

ridiculous	Inspiring scornful pity. <i>That ridiculous tartan cap.</i>
silly	Ridiculously trivial or frivolous. <i>A silly idea.</i>
slapstick	A device consisting of two flexible pieces of wood joined together at one end, used by clowns and in pantomime to produce a loud slapping noise. <i>Slapstick style of humor.</i>
<u>whimsical</u>	Playfully quaint or fanciful, especially in an appealing and amusing way. <i>The whimsical arbitrariness of autocracy.</i>
witticism	A message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>
<u>witty</u>	Combining clever conception and facetious expression. <i>A witty remark.</i>
