passionate Arising from intense feelings of sexual love.

Showing an unwillingness to make concessions to others, especially by

The **uncompromising** ugliness of the era s buildings.

Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to

violent react violently fervid.

Her dress was a violent red.

wild Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation.

Wild geese.

fury A feeling of intense anger.

Rachel shouted beside herself with **fury**.

An old-fashioned term for a psychological disorder characterized by

conversion of psychological stress into physical symptoms (somatization)

hysteria or a change in self-awareness (such as a fugue state or selective

amnesia).

The anti Semitic **hysteria** of the 1890s.

impassioned Characterized by intense emotion.

She made an **impassioned** plea for help.

Insane and believed to be affected by the phases of the moon.

A ward of **lunatic** old ladies.

Mental illness marked by periods of great excitement or euphoria,

mania delusions, and overactivity.

He had a **mania** for automobiles.



manic (in psychiatry) relating to or affected by mania.

Manic patients.

overwrought Deeply agitated especially from emotion.

She was too **overwrought** to listen to reason.

passionate Having, showing, or caused by strong feelings or beliefs.

A **passionate** kiss.

Any severe mental disorder in which contact with reality is lost or highly

psychosis distorted.

The symptoms of **psychosis**.

rampage Act violently, recklessly, or destructively.

Youths went on the **rampage** and wrecked a classroom.

raving In a raving manner.

Raving mad.

Any of several psychotic disorders characterized by distortions of reality

and disturbances of thought and language and withdrawal from social

schizophrenia contact.

Gibraltar s schizophrenia continues to be fed by colonial pride.

wild In a wild or undomesticated manner.

Edible **wild** plants.

zealot A fervent and even militant proponent of something.

Excessive intolerance of opposing views.

zealotry He expressed concern about religious **zealotry** playing an increasing

role in politics.

Zealous Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.

The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.
