Associations of "Racing" (30 Words)

auto	A car. <i>The auto industry.</i>
automobile	Travel in an automobile.
bicycle	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
bike	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals. <i>A bike ride.</i>
buggy	A light folding chair on wheels, in which a baby or young child can be pushed along. <i>Her two younger children were in a buggy.</i>
cavalcade	A formal procession of people walking, on horseback, or riding in vehicles. <i>The royal cavalcade proceeded through the city.</i>
coach	Teach and supervise someone act as a trainer or coach to as in sports. <i>Many employees are now flying coach instead of business class to Europe.</i>
cycle	The period of time taken to complete a cycle of events. <i>Cycle shorts.</i>
cycling	The sport or activity of riding a bicycle. Cycle racing has three main forms: road racing (typically over long distances), pursuit (on an oval track), and cyclo-cross (over rough, open country).
cyclist	A person who rides a bicycle.
driver	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>The hope of achieving such monopolies becomes the main driver of investment.</i>
equipage	The equipment for a particular purpose.

freewheel	Coast in a vehicle using the freewheel. <i>Another manager might have been willing to freewheel through one final season.</i>
horse	Provide with a horse or horses. <i>A 63 horse engine.</i>
jockey	Ride a racehorse as a professional jockey. <i>He s a truck jockey.</i>
<u>knight</u>	Raise someone to knighthood. <i>He was knighted for his services to industry.</i>
motorcycle	Ride a motorcycle.
mounted	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination- F.V.W.Mason. <i>The trim brass mounted carbine of the ranger.</i>
pedal	Move a bicycle by working its pedals. <i>She was pedalling a bicycle around town.</i>
pylon	A tower for guiding pilots or marking the turning point in a race. <i>Power pylons are a favorite target for terrorists.</i>
<u>ride</u>	Ride over along or through. <i>The ride is comfortable though there is a slight roll when cornering.</i>
rider	An addition or amendment to a bill at its third reading. <i>She was a skilled rider.</i>
riding	The sport or activity of riding horses. <i>A riding accident.</i>
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>A faded runner held in place with brass stair rods.</i>
scooter	Travel or ride on a scooter. <i>Scootering is the most economical and practical form of transportation.</i>
surrey	(in the US) a light four-wheeled carriage with two seats facing forwards.
taxi	Take a taxi as a means of transport. <i>The plane taxied to a halt at the terminal.</i>
trainer	One who trains other persons or animals. <i>A decent pair of trainers.</i>
<u>wagon</u>	A light horse-drawn vehicle, especially a covered one used by early settlers in North America and elsewhere. <i>A chip wagon.</i>
wheel	An instance of wheeling a turn or rotation. <i>A young woman is wheeled into the operating theatre.</i>
