auto	A car. The <b>auto</b> industry.
automobile	e Travel in an automobile.
bicycle	Ride a bicycle. They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.
bike	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals. <i>A <b>bike</b> ride.</i>
buggy	A light folding chair on wheels, in which a baby or young child can be pushed along. Her two younger children were in a <b>buggy</b> .
cavalcade	A formal procession of people walking, on horseback, or riding in vehicles. <i>The royal <b>cavalcade</b> proceeded through the city.</i>
coach	Teach and supervise someone act as a trainer or coach to as in sports. Many employees are now flying <b>coach</b> instead of business class to Europe.
<u>cycle</u>	The period of time taken to complete a cycle of events. <i>Cycle</i> shorts.
cycling	The sport or activity of riding a bicycle. Cycle racing has three main forms: road racing (typically over long distances), pursuit (on an oval track), and cyclo-cross (over rough, open country).
cyclist	A person who rides a bicycle.
<u>driver</u>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. The hope of achieving such monopolies becomes the main <b>driver</b> of investment.
equipage	The equipment for a particular purpose.



freewheel	Coast in a vehicle using the freewheel. Another manager might have been willing to <b>freewheel</b> through one final season.
horse	Provide with a horse or horses. A 63 <b>horse</b> engine.
jockey	Ride a racehorse as a professional jockey. <i>He s a truck <b>jockey</b>.</i>
<u>knight</u>	Raise someone to knighthood. He was <b>knight</b> ed for his services to industry.
motorcycle	Ride a motorcycle.
mounted	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination- F.V.W.Mason. <i>The trim brass <b>mounted</b> carbine of the ranger.</i>
pedal	Move a bicycle by working its pedals. She was <b>pedal</b> ling a bicycle around town.
pylon	A tower for guiding pilots or marking the turning point in a race. Power <b>pylon</b> s are a favorite target for terrorists.
<u>ride</u>	Ride over along or through. The <b>ride</b> is comfortable though there is a slight roll when cornering.
rider	An addition or amendment to a bill at its third reading. <i>She was a skilled <b>rider</b>.</i>
riding	The sport or activity of riding horses. A <b>riding</b> accident.
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. A faded <b>runner</b> held in place with brass stair rods.
scooter	Travel or ride on a scooter. <b>Scooter</b> ing is the most economical and practical form of transportation.
surrey	(in the US) a light four-wheeled carriage with two seats facing forwards.
taxi	Take a taxi as a means of transport. The plane <b>taxi</b> ed to a halt at the terminal.
trainer	One who trains other persons or animals. A decent pair of <b>trainer</b> s.
<u>wagon</u>	A light horse-drawn vehicle, especially a covered one used by early settlers in North America and elsewhere. <i>A chip wagon</i> .
wheel	An instance of wheeling a turn or rotation. A young woman is <b>wheel</b> ed into the operating theatre.
