## Associations of "Racing" (30 Words)

<b>auto</b>	A car. <i>The <b>auto</b> industry.</i>
<b>automobile</b>	Travel in an automobile.
<b>bicycle</b>	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
<b>bike</b>	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals. <i>A <b>bike</b> ride.</i>
<b>buggy</b>	A light folding chair on wheels, in which a baby or young child can be pushed along. <i>Her two younger children were in a <b>buggy</b>.</i>
<b>cavalcade</b>	A formal procession of people walking, on horseback, or riding in vehicles. <i>The royal <b>cavalcade</b> proceeded through the city.</i>
<b>coach</b>	Teach and supervise someone act as a trainer or coach to as in sports. <i>Many employees are now flying <b>coach</b> instead of business class to Europe.</i>
<b>cycle</b>	The period of time taken to complete a cycle of events. <i><b>Cycle</b> shorts.</i>
<b>cycling</b>	The sport or activity of riding a bicycle. Cycle racing has three main forms: road racing (typically over long distances), pursuit (on an oval track), and cyclo-cross (over rough, open country).
<b>cyclist</b>	A person who rides a bicycle.
<b>driver</b>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>The hope of achieving such monopolies becomes the main <b>driver</b> of investment.</i>
<b>equipage</b>	The equipment for a particular purpose.

<b>freewheel</b>	Coast in a vehicle using the freewheel. <i>Another manager might have been willing to <b>freewheel</b> through one final season.</i>
<b>horse</b>	Provide with a horse or horses. <i>A 63 <b>horse</b> engine.</i>
<b>jockey</b>	Ride a racehorse as a professional jockey. <i>He s a truck <b>jockey</b>.</i>
<b><u>knight</u></b>	Raise someone to knighthood. <i>He was <b>knighted</b> for his services to industry.</i>
<b>motorcycle</b>	Ride a motorcycle.
<b>mounted</b>	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination- F.V.W.Mason. <i>The trim brass <b>mounted</b> carbine of the ranger.</i>
<b>pedal</b>	Move a bicycle by working its pedals. <i>She was <b>pedalling</b> a bicycle around town.</i>
<b>pylon</b>	A tower for guiding pilots or marking the turning point in a race. <i>Power <b>pylons</b> are a favorite target for terrorists.</i>
<b><u>ride</u></b>	Ride over along or through. <i>The <b>ride</b> is comfortable though there is a slight roll when cornering.</i>
<b>rider</b>	An addition or amendment to a bill at its third reading. <i>She was a skilled <b>rider</b>.</i>
<b>riding</b>	The sport or activity of riding horses. <i>A <b>riding</b> accident.</i>
<b>runner</b>	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>A faded <b>runner</b> held in place with brass stair rods.</i>
<b>scooter</b>	Travel or ride on a scooter. <i><b>Scootering</b> is the most economical and practical form of transportation.</i>
<b>surrey</b>	(in the US) a light four-wheeled carriage with two seats facing forwards.
<b>taxi</b>	Take a taxi as a means of transport. <i>The plane <b>taxied</b> to a halt at the terminal.</i>
<b>trainer</b>	One who trains other persons or animals. <i>A decent pair of <b>trainers</b>.</i>
<b><u>wagon</u></b>	A light horse-drawn vehicle, especially a covered one used by early settlers in North America and elsewhere. <i>A chip <b>wagon</b>.</i>
<b>wheel</b>	An instance of wheeling a turn or rotation. <i>A young woman is <b>wheeled</b> into the operating theatre.</i>
