- commando** A unit of commandos.
*A **commando** attack.*
- curator** A keeper or custodian of a museum or other collection.
*The **curator** of drawings at the National Gallery.*
- custodian** A person who has responsibility for taking care of or protecting something.
*The **custodian** of the Great Seal in Canada is always the Secretary of State.*
- fire warden** A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning.
- forest fire fighter** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.
- guardian** A person who protects or defends something.
*I am acting as **guardian** of my late brother's family.*

keeper	A bar of soft iron placed across the poles of a horseshoe magnet to maintain its strength. <i>Hazelnuts are good keepers.</i>
preserver	A skilled worker who is employed to restore or refinish buildings or antique furniture. <i>The Benedictines have been best known as educators and as preservers of antique texts.</i>
protector	A regent in charge of a kingdom during the minority, absence, or incapacity of the sovereign. <i>Ear protectors.</i>
texas ranger	An official who is responsible for managing and protecting an area of forest.

***Arboreal** rodents.*

bamboo

The hard woody stems of bamboo plants used in construction and crafts and fishing poles.
*A section of **bamboo** about four feet long.*

batten

Furnish with battens.
***Batten** down a ship's hatches.*

botanical

A drug made from part of a plant (as the bark or root or leaves).
***Botanical** garden.*

bush

Dense vegetation consisting of stunted trees or bushes.
*They have to spend a night camping in the **bush**.*

cane	A strong slender often flexible stem as of bamboos reeds rattans or sugar cane. <i>A cane coffee table.</i>
deforest	Remove the trees from. <i>404 000 sq km had been deforested.</i>
dendroid	A graptolite (fossil marine invertebrate) of a type that formed much-branched colonies, found chiefly in the Ordovician and Silurian periods.
environmentalist	A person who is concerned about protecting the environment. <i>The environmentalist movement.</i>
fence	Enclose or separate an area with a fence. <i>Walkers may find themselves fenced out of the moor.</i>
forest	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A large tract of forest.</i>
garden	The flowers or vegetables or fruits or herbs that are cultivated in a garden. <i>They brought us tomatoes from their garden.</i>
glade	An open space in a wood or forest. <i>Glades of birch.</i>
grove	Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth. <i>An olive grove.</i>
guard	The person who plays the position of guard on a basketball team. <i>The left guard was injured on the play.</i>
hedge	Hinder or restrict with or as if with a hedge. <i>He hedged at every new question.</i>
hiding	The state of being hidden. <i>He went into hiding.</i>
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>The museum houses a collection of Roman sculpture.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>Lodge a bullet in the table.</i>
park	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. <i>A walk round the park.</i>
plantation	An estate on which crops such as coffee, sugar, and tobacco are grown. <i>New conifer plantations.</i>
prairie	A treeless grassy plain.

protect	Keep safe from harm or injury. <i>Weatherbeater protects your roof from the rain.</i>
protecting	Shielding (or designed to shield) against harm or discomfort. <i>A protecting alibi.</i>
safe	Strongbox where valuables can be safely kept. <i>You will be safe here.</i>
<u>shelter</u>	Provide shelter for. <i>The hut sheltered him from the cold wind.</i>
table	Multiplication tables. <i>More than 200 amendments to the bill have already been tabled.</i>
<u>warden</u>	The head of certain schools, colleges, or other institutions. <i>The warden of a nature reserve.</i>
