ambit	An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control. <i>The ambit of municipal legislation.</i>
apportionment	The act of distributing by allotting or apportioning; distribution according to a plan. <i>The apportionment of blame.</i>
<u>breadth</u>	The extent of something from side to side. <i>The boat measured 27 feet in breadth.</i>
<u>chain</u>	A measure of length equivalent to a chain 66 ft. <i>He slid the bolts on the front door and put the safety chain across.</i>
concatenate	Combine two strings to form a single one. <i>Concatenate terms.</i>
concatenation	The linking together of a consecutive series of symbols or events or ideas etc. <i>A complicated concatenation of circumstances.</i>
contiguity	The attribute of being so near as to be touching. <i>Contiguity is necessary in all forms of learning.</i>
cord	An anatomical structure resembling a length of cord e g the spinal cord or the umbilical cord. <i>She began toying with the telephone cord.</i>
cumulative	Increasing by successive addition. <i>The benefits are cumulative.</i>
delimit	Be opposite to; of angles and sides, in geometry. <i>Agreements delimiting fishing zones.</i>
<u>demarcate</u>	Set, mark, or draw the boundaries of something. <i>Plots of land demarcated by barbed wire.</i>
distribution	The commercial activity of transporting and selling goods from a producer to a consumer. <i>In complementary distribution.</i>

encircle	Form a circle around. <i>The town is encircled by fortified walls.</i>
even	Become even or more even. <i>The road was not very even.</i>
<u>extent</u>	The distance or area or volume over which something extends. <i>Everyone will have to compromise to some extent.</i>
grade	Assign a grade or rank to according to one's evaluation. <i>I took grade five and got a distinction.</i>
leash	Put a leash on a dog. <i>He called Azor to heel so that he could leash him.</i>
level	Make level or straight. <i>At six he could play chess at an advanced level.</i>
<u>magnitude</u>	A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10. <i>About the magnitude of a small pea.</i>
<u>orbit</u>	One complete circuit round an orbited body. <i>He plotted the orbit of the moon.</i>
<u>parameter</u>	A numerical or other measurable factor forming one of a set that defines a system or sets the conditions of its operation. <i>There are three parameters by which a speaker is able to modify the meaning of the utterance pitch volume and tempo.</i>
proportion	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>A dry martini has a large proportion of gin.</i>
rover	A player who has a rover ball. <i>They became rovers who departed further and further from civilization.</i>
satellite	Broadcast or disseminate via satellite. <i>With good motorway and rail links satellite towns like Thornbury have grown rapidly.</i>
<u>scope</u>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Plato even maintains religion to be the chief aim and scope of human life.</i>
<u>spectrum</u>	An ordered array of the components of an emission or wave. <i>The left or the right of the political spectrum.</i>
straddle	An act of sitting or standing with one's legs wide apart. <i>He turned the chair round and straddled it.</i>
stratum	People having the same social, economic, or educational status. <i>A stratum of flint.</i>
