once in a while On one occasion.

only now and then Without any others being included or involved.



only occasionally Never except when.

scarcely

Almost not.

Had **scarcely** rung the bell when the door flew open.

scarcely ever Almost not.

seldom Not often.

He was **seldom** absent.

sporadically

In a sporadic manner.

He only works **sporadically**.



Usage Examples of "Rarely" as an adverb

- I rarely drive above 50 mph.
- The rarely fine Sheraton bookcase.
- We rarely met.
- You can write rarely now, after all your schooling.

Slowly and with difficulty. She could hardly sit up.

infrequently Not often; rarely.

He cooks but only **infrequently**.

of a quantity not able to fulfill a need or requirement.

There was **insufficient** evidence to convict him.

meager Deficient in amount or quality or extent.

Meager resources.

meagerly

To a meager degree or in a meager manner.

These voices are **meagerly** represented at the conference.

occasional Occurring, appearing, or done infrequently and irregularly.

An **occasional** table.

occasionally Sporadically and infrequently.

He was arrogant and **occasionally** callous.

oddity A strange attitude or habit.

Realizing the **oddity** of the remark he retracted it.

often Frequently or in great quantities.

We **often** met over a cup of coffee.

Recurring only at long intervals.

Rare patches of green in the desert.

rareness Noteworthy scarcity.

Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting.

The **rarity** of the condition.

scant Provide grudgingly or in insufficient amounts.

He does not **scant** his attention to the later writings.

scanty Lacking in amplitude or quantity.

The women looked cold in their **scanty** bodices.

Scarcely.

Fresh vegetables were **scarce** during the drought.

scarcely
Only a very short time before.

They could **scarcely** all be wrong.

Not often.

A great but **seldom** pleasure.

On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always.

Sometimes I want to do things on my own.



Not dense. **sparse**

Information on earnings is **sparse**.

In a thinly dispersed manner; in small numbers. sparsely

A **sparsely** populated region.

Occasionally or at irregular intervals. sporadically

The comedy is only **sporadically** funny.

In a typical manner. typically

The illness **typically** lasts five to ten days.

Exceptionally; very. uncommonly

He is an **uncommonly** good talker.
