## Associations of "Rather than" (30 Words)

<b>about</b>	In or to a reversed position or direction. <i>We meet <b>about</b> once a month.</i>
<b>almost</b>	Not quite; very nearly. <i>We re <b>almost</b> finished.</i>
<b>appreciably</b>	To a noticeable degree. <i>Profits have grown <b>appreciably</b> over the last four years.</i>
<b>approximately</b>	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>A journey of <b>approximately</b> two hours.</i>
<b>around</b>	All around or on all sides. <i>She looked <b>around</b> her.</i>
<b>bit</b>	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Miranda could go off and do her theatrical <b>bit</b>.</i>
<b>comparatively</b>	To a moderate degree as compared to something else; relatively. <i>Inflation was <b>comparatively</b> low.</i>
<b>equidistant</b>	At equal distances. <i>The line joins together all points which are <b>equidistant</b> from the two axes.</i>
<b>fairly</b>	In conformity with the rules or laws and without fraud or cheating. <i>I was <b>fairly</b> certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
<b>few</b>	The RAF pilots who took part in the Battle of Britain. <i>It was designed for the discriminating <b>few</b>.</i>
<b>instead</b>	As an alternative or substitute. <i>She never married preferring <b>instead</b> to remain single.</i>
<b>least</b>	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>He had a knack for showing up when he was <b>least</b> expected.</i>
<b>less</b>	Lower in quality. <i><b>Less</b> than three weeks.</i>

<b>little</b>	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e.g little grebe. <i>What a nasty <b>little</b> situation.</i>
<b><u>moderately</u></b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>The event was <b>moderately</b> successful.</i>
<b>much</b>	To a great degree or extent. <i>I m not there <b>much</b>.</i>
<b><u>nearly</u></b>	In a close manner. <i>The person most <b>nearly</b> concerned.</i>
<b><u>partially</u></b>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>The work <b>partially</b> fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>
<b>perceptibly</b>	In a noticeable manner.
<b><u>possibly</u></b>	Perhaps (used to indicate doubt or hesitancy). <i>He found himself alone <b>possibly</b> the only survivor.</i>
<b>preferably</b>	More readily or willingly. <i>Clean it well <b>preferably</b> with warm water.</i>
<b><u>pretty</u></b>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>A <b>pretty</b> kettle of fish.</i>
<b><u>quite</u></b>	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>I <b>quite</b> agree.</i>
<b><u>ravishing</u></b>	Delightful; entrancing. <i>She looked <b>ravishing</b>.</i>
<b>reasonably</b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Ski wear which looks good and is <b>reasonably</b> priced.</i>
<b><u>roughly</u></b>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>People were crouching over <b>roughly</b> built brick fireplaces.</i>
<b><u>several</u></b>	Applied or regarded separately. <i><b>Several</b> letters came in the mail.</i>
<b><u>slightly</u></b>	To a small degree or extent. <i>A <b>slightly</b> built girl.</i>
<b><u>some</u></b>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He was still <b>some</b> distance away.</i>
<b><u>somewhat</u></b>	To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather. <i>His arguments were <b>somewhat</b> self contradictory.</i>
