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Associations of "Rather than" (30 Words)

about	In or to a reversed position or direction. <i>We meet about once a month.</i>
almost	Not quite; very nearly. <i>We re almost finished.</i>
appreciably	To a noticeable degree. <i>Profits have grown appreciably over the last four years.</i>
approximately	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>A journey of approximately two hours.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>She looked around her.</i>
bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Miranda could go off and do her theatrical bit.</i>
comparatively	To a moderate degree as compared to something else; relatively. <i>Inflation was comparatively low.</i>
equidistant	At equal distances. <i>The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.</i>
fairly	In conformity with the rules or laws and without fraud or cheating. <i>I was fairly certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
few	The RAF pilots who took part in the Battle of Britain. <i>It was designed for the discriminating few.</i>
instead	As an alternative or substitute. <i>She never married preferring instead to remain single.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g least shrew. <i>He had a knack for showing up when he was least expected.</i>
less	Lower in quality. <i>Less than three weeks.</i>

little	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e.g little grebe. <i>What a nasty little situation.</i>
<u>moderately</u>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>The event was moderately successful.</i>
much	To a great degree or extent. <i>I m not there much.</i>
<u>nearly</u>	In a close manner. <i>The person most nearly concerned.</i>
<u>partially</u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>The work partially fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>
perceptibly	In a noticeable manner.
<u>possibly</u>	Perhaps (used to indicate doubt or hesitancy). <i>He found himself alone possibly the only survivor.</i>
preferably	More readily or willingly. <i>Clean it well preferably with warm water.</i>
<u>pretty</u>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>A pretty kettle of fish.</i>
<u>quite</u>	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>I quite agree.</i>
<u>ravishing</u>	Delightful; entrancing. <i>She looked ravishing.</i>
reasonably	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Ski wear which looks good and is reasonably priced.</i>
<u>roughly</u>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>People were crouching over roughly built brick fireplaces.</i>
<u>several</u>	Applied or regarded separately. <i>Several letters came in the mail.</i>
<u>slightly</u>	To a small degree or extent. <i>A slightly built girl.</i>
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He was still some distance away.</i>
<u>somewhat</u>	To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather. <i>His arguments were somewhat self contradictory.</i>
