## Ratio as a Noun

### Definitions of "Ratio" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “ratio” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The relative magnitudes of two quantities (usually expressed as a quotient).*
- *The relation between things (or parts of things) with respect to their comparative quantity, magnitude, or degree.*
- *The quantitative relation between two amounts showing the number of times one value contains or is contained within the other.*



## Synonyms of "Ratio" as a noun (8 Words)

- balance** A weight that balances another weight.  
*Try to keep a **balance** between work and relaxation.*
- comparative extent** The comparative form of an adjective or adverb.
- comparative number** The comparative form of an adjective or adverb.
- correlation** A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation.  
*The increasingly similar basis underlying national soil maps allows **correlation** to take place more easily.*
- [correspondence](#) Communication by exchanging letters, emails, or other messages.  
*Sophie wrote a letter to Rosamund with whom she kept up a regular **correspondence**.*



**proportion** Balance among the parts of something.  
*The view of what constitutes perfect bodily **proportions** changes from one generation to the next.*

**quantitative relation** An act of narration.

**relationship** A relation between people relationship is often used where relation would serve as in the relationship between inflation and unemployment but the preferred usage of relationship is for human relations or states of relatedness.  
*He didn't want his wife to know of the **relationship**.*



### Usage Examples of "Ratio" as a noun

- *The ratio of average prices to average salaries is at its lowest number for years.*
- *The ratio of men's jobs to women's is 8 to 1.*

<b>enormous</b>	Extraordinarily large in size or extent or amount or power or degree. <i>The possibilities are <b>enormous</b>.</i>
<b><u>extent</u></b>	The point or degree to which something extends. <i>To a certain <b>extent</b> she was right.</i>
<b>gargantuan</b>	Enormous. <i>A <b>gargantuan</b> appetite.</i>
<b>huge</b>	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>A <b>huge</b> wave.</i>
<b>immense</b>	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>At vast or <b>immense</b> expense.</i>
<b>largeness</b>	The capacity to understand a broad range of topics. <i>The might have repercussions of unimaginable <b>largeness</b>.</i>
<b>mammoth</b>	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>A <b>mammoth</b> corporation.</i>
<b>massive</b>	(of rocks or beds) having no discernible form or structure. <i><b>Massive</b> crowds are expected.</i>
<b>monstrous</b>	Having the ugly or frightening appearance of a monster. <i>It is a <b>monstrous</b> waste of money.</i>
<b>odds</b>	The balance of advantage; superiority in strength, power, or resources. <i>The <b>odds</b> against this ever happening are high.</i>
<b>ogre</b>	(folklore) a giant who likes to eat human beings. <i>It is clear that I am no <b>ogre</b>.</i>

<b>oversize</b>	Larger than normal for its kind.
<b>oversized</b>	Bigger than the usual size. <i>An <b>oversized</b> T shirt.</i>
<b>part</b>	To some extent partly often used to contrast different parts of something. <i>He coped well with the percussion <b>part</b>.</i>
<b><u>portion</u></b>	Something less than the whole of a human artifact. <i>Every month you send the agency a single payment that is <b>portioned</b> out to each of your creditors until your debts are paid off.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. <i>A <b>prodigious</b> vision.</i>
<b>proportion</b>	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>The view of what constitutes perfect bodily <b>proportions</b> changes from one generation to the next.</i>
<b><u>proportional</u></b>	(of a variable quantity) having a constant ratio to another quantity. <i>The punishment should be <b>proportional</b> to the crime.</i>
<b>quota</b>	A fixed share of something that a person or group is entitled to receive or is bound to contribute. <i>All the salesmen met their <b>quota</b> for the month.</i>
<b>sized</b>	Having a specified size. <i>Comfortably <b>sized</b> rooms.</i>
<b>stupendous</b>	Extremely impressive. <i>The most <b>stupendous</b> views.</i>
<b><u>symmetry</u></b>	The quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis. <i>The political <b>symmetry</b> between the two debates.</i>
<b>titanic</b>	Of great force or power. <i>A series of <b>titanic</b> explosions.</i>
<b><u>tremendous</u></b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>Penny put in a <b>tremendous</b> amount of time.</i>
