captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A captivating smile.</i>
charming	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>Endowed with charming manners.</i>
dazzling	Shining intensely. <i>The skater s dazzling virtuosic leaps.</i>

delightful	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A delightful secluded garden.</i>
enchancing	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Enchancing music.</i>
entrancing	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Antique papers of entrancing design.</i>
exquisite	Highly sensitive or discriminating. <i>Her exquisite face.</i>
gorgeous	Dazzlingly beautiful. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
lovely	Lovable especially in a childlike or naive way. <i>She looked lovely.</i>
magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. <i>Magnificent cathedrals.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>Plants convert the radiant energy of the sun into chemical energy.</i>
striking	Dramatically good-looking or beautiful. <i>A striking resemblance between parent and child.</i>
stunning	Causing great astonishment and consternation. <i>Quite stunning with large dark eyes and a beautiful high bosomed figure.</i>
very beautiful	Being the exact same one; not any other.
wonderful	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>

attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>A stunningly attractive charismatic man.</i>
beautiful	(of weather) highly enjoyable. <i>A beautiful painting.</i>

beauty	The qualities that give pleasure to the senses. <i>He arrived with a blonde beauty on his arm.</i>
becoming	Suitable or appropriate. <i>Do not talk too much to your cousins it s not becoming.</i>
belle	A young woman who is the most charming and beautiful of several rivals. <i>The belle of the ball.</i>
charming	Very pleasant or attractive. <i>A charming country cottage.</i>
comeliness	The quality of being good looking and attractive.
comely	Pleasant to look at; attractive (typically used of a woman). <i>The comely Italian actress Valeria Golino.</i>
dame	A woman of refinement. <i>A matronly dame presided at the table.</i>
enamored	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness. <i>Narcissus was a beautiful Greek youth who became enamored of his own reflection.</i>
enchantingly	In a bewitching manner.
gaily	With a bright or attractive appearance. <i>He waved gaily to the crowd.</i>
gorgeous	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>A gorgeous Victorian gown.</i>
gracefully	In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>He has aged gracefully.</i>
handsome	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i>Handsome cookery books.</i>
lovely	Used as an affectionate form of address. <i>Lovely views.</i>
lyrical	Suitable for or suggestive of singing. <i>He gained a devoted following for his lyrical cricket writing.</i>
ma'am	A woman of refinement.
maiden	An over in which no runs are scored. <i>The top priced maiden heifer.</i>
perfection	A person or thing considered to be perfect. <i>The satiny perfection of her skin.</i>
perfumery	The art of making perfumes. <i>An oil used in perfumery.</i>

picturesque	(of language) unusual and vivid. <i>The salad has no regional or picturesque name.</i>
pretty	Make pretty or attractive. <i>Pretty big.</i>
recherche	Lavishly elegant and refined.
scenic	Providing or relating to views of impressive or beautiful natural scenery. <i>The scenic route from Florence to Siena.</i>
strikingly	In a way that attracts attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>Their methods of work differed strikingly.</i>
stunning	Causing great astonishment and consternation. <i>Laid the poor fellow senseless with one stunning blow.</i>
sylph	An imaginary spirit of the air. <i>An oh so slim sylph dressed in a black leotard.</i>
timepiece	A measuring instrument or device for keeping time.
visually	With respect to vision. <i>A visually stunning film.</i>
