eagerness	Prompt willingness. They showed no eagerness to spread the gospel.
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. Enthusiasm for his program is growing.
facility	Absence of difficulty or effort. An overdraft facility .
fitness	Fitness to traverse the seas. A fitness test.
forwardness	Prompt willingness. I hope that my forwardness hasn t offended you.



gameness	Disability of walking due to crippling of the legs or feet.
<u>handy</u>	United States blues musician who transcribed and published traditional blues music (1873-1958.
inclination	The action of inclining the body or head. Cometary orbits vary widely in inclination .
keenness	A quick and penetrating intelligence. He has expressed his keenness to retain his job.
on hand	One of two sides of an issue.
preparation	A substance that is specially made up, especially a medicine or food. <i>The resolution of one dissonance is often the preparation for another <i>dissonance</i>.</i>
preparedness	The state of having been made ready or prepared for use or action (especially military action. The country maintained a high level of military preparedness .
promptness	The quality or habit of adhering to an appointed time.
punctuality	The fact or quality of being on time. <i>He was a stickler for punctuality.</i>
<u>quickness</u>	The quality of being prompt to understand, think, or learn. An athlete with outstanding quickness and agility.
rapidity	A rate that is rapid. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary</i> rapidity .
ready	Poised for action. Their guns were at the ready .
set	A group of things of the same kind that belong together and are so used. A set of books.
<u>speed</u>	The ratio of the focal length to the diameter of a (camera) lens system. <i>Wish me good speed</i> .
speediness	A rate that is rapid.
swiftness	Lack of delay; promptness. The turtle ran on shore with remarkable swiftness .
timeliness	The fact or quality of being done or occurring at a favourable or useful time. Managers were happy with the timeliness of the deliveries.
<u>willingness</u>	The quality or state of being prepared to do something; readiness. <i>He expressed his willingness to help.</i>



zeal

Prompt willingness. *He felt a kind of religious zeal.*
