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## Associations of "Real time" (30 Words)

<b><u>actual</u></b>	Used to emphasize the important aspect of something. <i><b>Actual</b> heroism.</i>
<b>almanac</b>	An annual calendar containing important dates and statistical information such as astronomical data and tide tables.
<b>annually</b>	Without missing a year. <i>Sales are increasing by about 17 <b>annually</b>.</i>
<b>april</b>	The month following March and preceding May.
<b><u>biannual</u></b>	Occurring twice a year. <i>The <b>biannual</b> meeting of the planning committee.</i>
<b><u>daily</u></b>	A woman who is employed to clean someone else’s house each day. <i>Boats can be hired for a <b>daily</b> rate.</i>
<b><u>frequent</u></b>	Frequently encountered. <i>Walls flanked by <b>frequent</b> square towers.</i>
<b>hour</b>	A time of day specified as an exact number of hours from midnight or midday. <i>Licensing <b>hours</b>.</i>
<b>monthly</b>	A magazine that is published once a month. <i>The <b>monthly</b> newsletter.</i>
<b>now</b>	Used when pausing or considering one’s next words. <i>It is <b>now</b> clear that we should not pursue this policy.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>We <b>often</b> met over a cup of coffee.</i>
<b><u>perennial</u></b>	A perennial plant. <i>Cow parsley is <b>perennial</b>.</i>
<b>period</b>	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>Picasso s blue <b>period</b>.</i>
<b><u>periodic</u></b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>

<b>periodical</b>	Happening or recurring at regular intervals. <i>Britain's best <b>periodical</b> art magazine.</i>
<b>periodically</b>	In a sporadic manner. <i>The lamps were <b>periodically</b> switched on and off at 30 minute intervals.</i>
<b>present</b>	Bring forward and present to the mind. <i>A doctor must be <b>present</b> at the ringside.</i>
<b>punctuality</b>	The quality or habit of adhering to an appointed time. <i>He was a stickler for <b>punctuality</b>.</i>
<b>realistic</b>	Aware or expressing awareness of things as they really are. <i>A <b>realistic</b> description.</i>
<b>reality</b>	Relating to reality TV. <i>Youth when death has no <b>reality</b>.</i>
<b>realized</b>	Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>The joy of a <b>realized</b> ambition overcame him.</i>
<b>regular</b>	A soldier in the regular army. <i>A <b>regular</b> polygon.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	The state or quality of being regular. <i>He was famous for the <b>regularity</b> of his habits.</i>
<b>regularly</b>	In a regular way without variation. <i>Leaves arranged <b>regularly</b> along the stem.</i>
<b>semiannual</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year.
<b>thereafter</b>	From that time on. <i>It was agreed that the meeting be held annually <b>thereafter</b>.</i>
<b>timing</b>	A particular point or period of time when something happens. <i>One of the secrets of cricket is good <b>timing</b>.</i>
<b>twice</b>	Two times; on two occasions. <i>The earl married <b>twice</b>.</i>
<b>weekly</b>	Relating to or calculated in terms of a week. <i>There was a <b>weekly</b> dance on Wednesdays.</i>
<b>year</b>	A set of students grouped together as being of roughly similar ages mostly entering a school or college in the same academic year. <i>Most of the girls in my <b>year</b> were leaving at the end of the term.</i>
