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| <u>actual</u> | Used to emphasize the important aspect of something. <i>Actual heroism.</i> |
| almanac | An annual calendar containing important dates and statistical information such as astronomical data and tide tables. |
| annually | Without missing a year. <i>Sales are increasing by about 17 annually.</i> |
| april | The month following March and preceding May. |
| <u>biannual</u> | Occurring twice a year. <i>The biannual meeting of the planning committee.</i> |
| <u>daily</u> | A woman who is employed to clean someone else’s house each day. <i>Boats can be hired for a daily rate.</i> |
| <u>frequent</u> | Frequently encountered. <i>Walls flanked by frequent square towers.</i> |
| hour | A time of day specified as an exact number of hours from midnight or midday. <i>Licensing hours.</i> |
| monthly | A magazine that is published once a month. <i>The monthly newsletter.</i> |
| now | Used when pausing or considering one’s next words. <i>It is now clear that we should not pursue this policy.</i> |
| oft | Many times at short intervals. <i>We often met over a cup of coffee.</i> |
| <u>perennial</u> | A perennial plant. <i>Cow parsley is perennial.</i> |
| period | A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>Picasso s blue period.</i> |
| <u>periodic</u> | Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The periodic appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i> |

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| periodical | Happening or recurring at regular intervals. <i>Britain's best periodical art magazine.</i> |
| periodically | In a sporadic manner. <i>The lamps were periodically switched on and off at 30 minute intervals.</i> |
| present | Bring forward and present to the mind. <i>A doctor must be present at the ringside.</i> |
| punctuality | The quality or habit of adhering to an appointed time. <i>He was a stickler for punctuality.</i> |
| realistic | Aware or expressing awareness of things as they really are. <i>A realistic description.</i> |
| reality | Relating to reality TV. <i>Youth when death has no reality.</i> |
| realized | Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>The joy of a realized ambition overcame him.</i> |
| regular | A soldier in the regular army. <i>A regular polygon.</i> |
| regularity | The state or quality of being regular. <i>He was famous for the regularity of his habits.</i> |
| regularly | In a regular way without variation. <i>Leaves arranged regularly along the stem.</i> |
| semiannual | Occurring or payable twice each year. |
| thereafter | From that time on. <i>It was agreed that the meeting be held annually thereafter.</i> |
| timing | A particular point or period of time when something happens. <i>One of the secrets of cricket is good timing.</i> |
| twice | Two times; on two occasions. <i>The earl married twice.</i> |
| weekly | Relating to or calculated in terms of a week. <i>There was a weekly dance on Wednesdays.</i> |
| year | A set of students grouped together as being of roughly similar ages mostly entering a school or college in the same academic year. <i>Most of the girls in my year were leaving at the end of the term.</i> |
